PLEASE HELP DISTRIBUTE THE PARISH NEWS IN MIDDLETON

As readers will know from previous appeals, the Parish News is distributed free to households in Middleton, North Runcton and East Winch. We could not do this without our dedicated volunteers, all of whom are crucial to the viability and future of the magazine.

Distribution is a two stage process. First, the copies are collated into "bundles" of various size and delivered to our network of local distributors. The second stage is for those distributors to deliver the copies to individual houses on their route.

We urgently need the help of **two new volunteers** with their own transport to assist with the first stage of that process. Six times a year, the "bundles" need to be collected from Church Farm after 12.00 noon on the last Thursday of the month. The "bundles" need to be delivered as quickly as possible to the local distributors so that the magazine can be distributed to individual homes by the end of the month. Although it could all be done by one volunteer, ideally it would be better to spread the load and have two people, one to deliver 15 bundles to distributors from Station Road and Fair Green to the A47 and a second driver to take 9 bundles from School Road to Blackborough End.

In addition, we need a local distributor to deliver 12 magazines in Park Hill. The lady who has delivered them for 20 years is approaching her nineties and has difficulty walking. Can anyone who lives in this area please help?

Following a successful pilot session last November, the first Tea with a Pony event is scheduled to take place at the Magpie Centre, home of West Norfolk Riding for the Disabled Association, at Wallington Hall, South Runcton, PE33 0AP on **22nd April**. These sessions are planned to take place every month during the summer.

Designed for people living with dementia, and their carers, the session will include tea and cakes, plus the chance for participants to meet and greet some of the ponies and view the wheelchair-friendly carriages which are used in carriage driving lessons. There will also be a 'sensory table' with items of tack and grooming kit for participants to handle and to provide a stimulus for conversation.

The cost is £10 per participant and carer, so if you or anyone you know would like to attend, please call the Centre on 01553 810202 to register your interest.

Volunteers are also needed to make and serve tea and cakes, so if you can help with these tasks, your assistance will be warmly welcomed.

Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

The provision of a footpath at the allotment field is still under discussion.

A tree survey within the parish will be carried out to determine if there are trees that need protection orders placed on them.

The installation of the defibrillator at the Village Hall is imminent. Once this is carried out it is hoped that there will be an opportunity to publicise the fact in the local press.

The installation of a fence around the allotments is being proposed as the existing fencing is piecemeal and in the main consists of old pallets. Quotations have been received and a final decision will be made at the April Parish Council (PC) meeting.

The battery in one of the Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) has failed, the VAS was the one donated by Sibelco. They will be approached to see if they are willing to provide a replacement battery.

As usual, Simon Nash and Peter Gidney, our Borough Councillors attend the meeting. Both councillors expressed concern over the proposed building of 300 houses adjacent to the A10 as a roundabout is also being proposed at the site.

With traffic on the A10 already at a peak, a roundabout would only make matters worse. It is feared that there will be a rat-run via Setch Road, Sandy Lane and School Road.

Since his election Graham Middleton, our County Councillor has not attended any of the PC meetings. This is very disappointing as it means the PC has no idea what is happening at County except what is in the press.

The large puddle adjacent to the new bus shelter in Station Road will again be reported to the Norwich County Council (NCC) Highways. The puddle is the result of damage caused by lorries using the road.

East Winch Parish Council Meeting, 2nd March 2020

The Parish Council has been depleted by 2 recent resignations. Both former councillors will be much missed, and we are very grateful for the work they have done over the years.

There are now only 4 councillors and the need to co-opt more is urgent. The Clerk informed the meeting that if there were so few that the meeting wasn't quorate, the Borough Council could appoint its own representatives. While this would enable the Council to continue, the appointee might have less understanding of the affairs of this village than local people.

A report was received from The Friends of East Winch and West Bilney. Their fundraising had raised £2500, and a local employer had made an informal but very favourable offer. They were going to continue fundraising locally, but also will apply to big funders such as the Lottery. Their next event would be a Mind, Body and Soul day on 25th April.

Parishioners had complained that some buses don't stop at the Old Maid's Head and that there is no longer a bus stop sign or timetable at the stop on the opposite side of the road. The chair said she'd written to Highways England about the bus stop sign and they had replied saying it was the responsibility of Highways Norfolk. Accordingly, the reply has been forwarded to them.

The clerk had queried a previous communication from Highways Norfolk refusing to put up a Slow sign on Paws Lane, West Bilney. Regrettably, they refused again.

We discussed how to safeguard the telephone box library. The policeman dealing with the complaint had advised a wildlife camera, but it seems there is a law against filming on the

highway, and there could be legal difficulties if, for example, a minor was filmed. A parishioner attending the meeting agreed to check whether a lock would be effective.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is on Monday, 18th May. Annual Parish meeting at 7 and council meeting at 7.30.




