With the distribution of this edition of the Parish News, Gillian Boon ends some 47 years of service to our parish magazine and community.

Gillian has been actively involved with the Parish News from the very start when it was decided to produce a church magazine that would be distributed free to every home in Middleton and, at that time, East Winch.

Gillian recalls that she was asked to edit the new magazine and her friend, Carol Atkins, did the typing. Gillian says: "In those days, it was literally "cut and paste". The stencils were cut by Carol and the magazine was run off on an old Gestetner machine. The sheets were then collated and stapled and bundled for distribution."

Over the years, the task of Editor eventually passed to others. But until we moved to professional printing in 2015, Gillian continued to organise the collating and stapling process, assisted by her husband Edward and a loyal team of volunteers, and throughout the whole period has remained at the heart of the distribution system on which the viability of the magazine ultimately depends.

It is impossible to exaggerate the huge personal contribution that Gillian has made to the life of our villages. As she begins a well-earned retirement from these duties, I would like to take

this opportunity on behalf of all readers to thank Gillian for all her hard work over so many years.

I am also extremely pleased to announce that David and Emily Colgan who live in North Runcton have very kindly volunteered to take over from Gillian the responsibility for managing the future distribution of the Parish News. Many thanks to David and Emily even if they have not, very understandably, committed to do it for the next 47 years!

East Winch Parish Council Meetings 22 February and 7 March

The meeting of 22nd February was convened to discuss planning application 22/00141/F for an extension to Fulwood House, Church Lane, and a bat question relating to 21/010931/F (Home Farm, Gayton Rd). The council had no objection to the former application, and considered the bat question would not affect their prior approval of the latter.

A street party for the Jubilee was also discussed. It had been possible to apply for a grant to fund celebrations, but on investigation it turned out that the deadline had been passed. As the council had recently been notified that their application for £10,000 from the Road Safety Community Fund towards the cost of making a trod to Ashwick Rd had been refused, they didn't feel able to contribute from council funds, which may now all be needed for the trod.

On the 7th March, it was reported that though the first part of the right of way to Middleton Towers was in good condition, once the path crossed Mr Barclay's land that was not the case, particularly the quagmire where Sibelco traffic crossed. The council and Cllr Moriarty had made representations to NCC, but nothing appeared to have changed, and the clerk will follow it up.

A contact at Highways England had been prompt and helpful when the council had complained that one of the roadworks signs blocked visibility for larger vehicles at the Common Rd/A47 junction. So it had been decided to tackle him about the railings, but so far there has been no response.

It was reported that NCC had delayed granting planning permission for Sibelco to start excavating Min 40, because it considered that the provision offered for rerouting the right of way Public Footpath East Winch 2 wasn't good enough. The Ramblers' Association and the NCC Public Rights of Way team had both objected. Sibelco had therefore sidestepped NCC and appealed to the Secretary of State

(SoS) on the grounds of non-determination. NCC discussed the issue anyway, and informed the SoS that if they had been discussing the application it would have been refused on the grounds of loss of amenity. It's now in the hands of the SoS, and if he turns Sibelco's application down, Sibelco will have to renegotiate their plan for the right of way with NCC. It's the only issue outstanding.

Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

The Parish Council met on the 2nd of February and also the 2nd of March.

We continued our discussions on the marking of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. It was decided that the PC will go ahead and book the hog roast to be served before the lighting of the beacon on Thursday the 2nd of June. There will also be a converted horse box serving drinks and cakes. Other arrangements are still to be confirmed. Hopefully it should be a really nice event that can be provided for the village. It is also hoped that we will be able to provide live music at the event, so if anybody is in a band or knows of one that would like to perform outside at the event then please get in touch with me. Any help or support with this event would be gratefully received. At this point we only have one non parish council volunteer. The event will be free of charge to villagers with buckets for donations.

The saplings on the playing field are growing well and we are trying to obtain more to fill in the gaps and continue the planting area.

Councillor Gidney reported that the parking charges in King's Lynn are increasing again to help maintain the town. Many councillors felt that this was entirely the wrong approach as it drives more people to shop at the Hardwick Retail Park or at other towns where parking is free. Councillor Nash reported that it had been proposed to offer cheaper parking in the lead up to Christmas but it didn't happen. He suggested that cheaper parking be offered when football is low in January and February but this didn't happen either.

The PC sadly learned that our current clerk has offered her resignation and will be leaving at the end of March. The position has been advertised with NALC and hopefully a replacement will be found soon. The PC would like to thank Elaine for her time with us and the tremendous help she has been. We will all miss her and wish her well.

For this reason we are not sure if we will have a meeting in April. If not, the next meeting will be Wednesday 4th of May.

IS YOUR HOME HARD TO HEAT?

If you live in private rented accommodation, and your home is hard to keep warm, the Borough Council of King's Lynn and West Norfolk may be able to help.

Your landlord must make sure your home is not unreasonably hard to heat by making sure it meets energy efficiency standards. It is unlawful for landlords to let out a property with an Energy Performance Certificate rated F or G (in properties where an EPC is legally required).

The council can advise people about EPC standards and may act to make landlords undertake relevant improvements.

The council is also ready to support landlords with advice about how to access grants that may help meet the cost of making energy efficiency improvements.

Wellness lake development, Ashwick Rd

On 9th March, application 21/00262/FM was re-presented to the Borough Council Planning Dept. Comment needs to be made within 21 days, at least in theory. We have until 30th March to respond. At the time of writing I have not been able to access the site, so am not sure what is different. As before, the planning officer is Mr Wilkinson.

The Children's Society Box Coordinator

North Runcton News

In spite of what can only be described as the most uncertain political and economic outlook for several decades, BCKLWN are still apparently bent on pushing ahead with their growth scenario for Lynn and West Norfolk.

The impetus for all this dates back now more than 15 years to the BCKLWN decision to seek 'Growth Point' status for King's Lynn, although, as far as can be established, the implications of this decision were never fully identified at the time. Certainly, nobody seems to be able to remember any public consultation about it.

The decision led to the formulation of the BCKLWN local plan Core Strategy (2011) – indicating an objective to deliver 16,500 new dwellings by 2026. Those dwellings have since been delivered at over 500 a year – but the recent Local Plan Review still proposes another 11,000 by 2036.

These figures will represent a 30% growth of housing in the Borough since 2001. The issue of infrastructure delivery to accommodate this expansion has been raised many times, but we are still of the view that it has never been properly addressed.

New Five-Parish Coalition: This is obviously of great consequence for North Runcton and West Winch (where, as you will know, the single biggest growth area of 4000 dwellings is proposed). The Parish Councils have therefore recently agreed to form a coalition with South Wootton, North Wootton and Castle Rising, who are also directly affected by the growth plans – and principally we wish to lobby for a comprehensive transport strategy for King's Lynn and the sub-region.

We are all of the view that the current proposed growth will be heavily car dependent and as such will fail to create communities that can be carbon neutral and that utilise 'multi-modal' transport opportunities. Yet these are the goals of national and local planning policies. In short – the current plans are contrary to sustainable development goals.

Planning: NRPC and WWPC have recently met BCKLWN and NCC representatives for two zoom meetings to discuss the 'Relief Road' (where we have raised the concerns outlined above). We were alarmed to learn that an application for government road funding had suggested it might be a 60mph road (contrary to the adopted Neighbourhood Plan). We have still not seen any detailed design for the road – and most of the design parameters recently outlined by NCC were, in our opinion, identified a decade ago.

The 'Hopkins Homes' outline application for 1100 dwellings is still live. Please consider submitting your comments on the planning portal (reference number 13/01615/OM). (Hopkins were actually bought out by 'Terra Firma Capital' at the turn of the year who also own the much larger Kier housebuilding business).

Please also review the revised application submitted by Metacre Ltd for 500 homes to be located between Rectory Lane and Chequers Lane (reference number 18/02289/OM).

This was first submitted in late 2018, but then withdrawn due to concerns raised by BCKLWN. Metacre are a subsidiary of Northern Trust, a developer from Lancashire. We imagine they will sell the site to a builder should they get planning consent.

The Parish Councils remain of the view that both applications are premature until such time as the aforementioned sustainability issues can be properly addressed.

Queens Platinum Jubilee: Village Tea Party, Sunday 5th June:

On a happier note – please put this date in your diary for a Sunday afternoon tea party at the Village Meeting Place. We are envisaging cakes, games, more cakes and some village history. Please bring along any old photographs, maps, documents or artefacts that you consider part of our parish history. It is a long-held goal of the PC to gather together this information for a permanent record. We have already compiled quite a lot of information, but we know some of you have more!

An event is also being proposed on Friday 3rd at the Cricket Club ... possibly involving a 'beacon'?! More details will be advertised closer to the date.

The North Runcton Conservation Volunteers

The North Runcton Conservation Volunteers have met once over the winter to tidy up saplings that were planted last year on Hardwick Common and replace those lost with a selection of native trees and shrubs.

A planned litter pick was cancelled due to Storm Eunice, but we have recently met to make bird boxes which will be erected around the commons. The litter pick has been re-scheduled for Saturday 26th March – meet on Setch Road near the (old) clay pit entrance. Please wear boots and gloves.

We are a small friendly group and plan to have further sessions over the spring and summer as the need arises.
