# Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

As with many organisations, because of Coronavirus the PC has not been meeting on a regular basis. Using the zoom facility the PC has held meetings in June and July.

Now that the majority of the PC can use zoom as from September the PC will once again resume meetings on the first Wednesday of the month. If any parishioner wishes to bring up an issue with the PC, they should contact the Parish Clerk so they can be included in the meeting at the fifteen minute open forum. This can be either by zoom or telephone.

The PC was approached by a resident of Hill Road to ask for its support in the proposal to number the properties on that road. The PC felt that it was up to the individual residents on Hill Road if they wanted their properties numbered therefore the PC agreed that it could not support this request.

The owner of the land adjacent to the allotments will be asked to use the entrance off Sandy Lane as agreed that once the water supply was connected to the field.

The bus shelter at the Middleton Steak House, previously The Crown Public House, needs some repairs but because of coronavirus there has been some delay in getting estimates for the repair.

The PC received a letter from a resident in Blackborough End regarding the provision of speed bumps in the village. Norfolk County Council informed the PC that speed pumps are not suitable in Blackborough End.

It was reported that a shrine has been erected at Sandy Corner in respect of the teenager killed in a road traffic accident earlier this year. A member of the public felt that it was a distraction at this corner and could result in another accident. Highways were approached regarding its removal but the PC were told that because of the sensitive nature of the shrine they would not be taking any action.

The play equipment at the playing field should not be used because of the coronavirus but, in spite of notices to this effect, people are still using some of the equipment. This is risky as it could help to spread the virus, something we should all be avoiding.

## **Stewart's Marathon Challenge**

Earlier in the year I wrote in the Parish News that I was training for the London Marathon. That was before Covid-19.



My training schedule was severely disrupted by the lockdown and again when the London Marathon was postponed from April to Sunday 4th October. But I am now back in the swing of things and I look forward to running the 26.2 miles. If the London Marathon ends up being cancelled, which seems likely in the circumstances, I shall run my own personal Marathon instead – locally, along Peddars Way.

The reason for putting my 72-year-old body through all this effort is to raise money for Kidney Research UK. Their work is vital as there is still no cure for kidney disease. There are 3 million kidney disease sufferers in the UK, including 5,000 on the kidney transplant waiting list. Hundreds died last year, while waiting forlornly for a transplant. From our own experience we know the misery this illness can cause as both our sons have had kidney failure. I donated a kidney to Joel in 1999 and Oliver had a transplant in 2002.

## **EAST WINCH NEWS**

East Winch's unhappy relationship with the "improvements" on the A47.

Everyone was very happy when we were told that Highways England would be putting in new railings at the junction of Gayton Rd and the A47, creating a pedestrian crossing, and reducing the speed limit to 40mph.

There is no problem with the speed limit - provided it's observed - but the pedestrian crossing turned out to be a dip in the pavement with a special bobbly paving stone to alert blind people, and one end of it ends up in someone's driveway! People had expected a crossing with traffic lights, and were deeply disappointed.

The railings have been a disaster. They follow the curve of the path, and to a driver emerging from Gayton road they blend together so that it is impossible to see through them. They are so high that people in ordinary cars can't see over them either. So you take your life in your hands every time you turn onto the A47.

The Parish Council and many individuals in the village have emailed Highways England to complain, but their response has been that the safety audit was unclear and that the police approved the railings! Please will everyone driving towards Swaffham be very conscious that there may be a hidden driver trying to get out onto the road. Please don't exceed the speed limit and keep alert!

#### Our phone box library

Thanks to Mr Bland and his family, the phone box library has been a great success. People use it, and value it. Mr Bland takes a lot of trouble to plant pretty flowers around it. So it has been very upsetting that since it was opened, it has been vandalised three times. The people who think it's funny to throw the books around in the road should remember that it has been really kind of the Blands to do this for us, and that you aren't just showing you think the village is a lousy place to be, but also actually hurting a person.

# "SCRUB HUB" IN NORTH RUNCTON

The people of this country always respond well in a crisis. And there can be no doubt that the coronavirus pandemic has posed the biggest threat to the life and prosperity of this country since the Second World War.

There have been many stories in the national and local media about the amazing actions that individuals and groups have taken to raise money for charity, support neighbours or supply food and other necessities to those in need.

At the height of the crisis, there was a desperate shortage of Personal Protective Equipment for health and care workers. Sally Pryke, who lives in North Runcton, saw a request on the local news from the Norfolk Scrubs Volunteers Group seeking volunteers to make scrubs.

Sally said "I contacted the group and in turn was contacted by one of the Admin Volunteers. I was asked to make laundry bags and Scrubhats whilst waiting for a delivery of fabric. Neighbours responded very generously with donations of sheets, pillowcases and duvets for me to make bags and I made some masks from my own 'fabric stash'!



Once my local area had identified a Volunteer to act as an 'Area Lead' I received my first delivery of fabric to make into Scrubs. There was amazing support and help available online from the Norfolk Scrubs Volunteers

Group, in particular from our own local Facebook Group, with any queries I had. My sewing experience was somewhat limited, so the first ones made were very challenging!

Fabric was supplied from financial donations to purchase the fabric or actual donations of fabric. I believe some people, early on, did supply their own fabric.

I sewed continuously for 10 weeks, only being able to do so, because of the support from my husband, who kept me fed and watered! I have had a short break for a couple of weeks as all fabric has been made up and Norfolk



have managed to complete all their orders. The group now await some special Rainbow fabric, designed for Noah Evans, (son of Chris Evans), who slept outdoors for 28 nights to raise money for Scrubs fabric, to make up some more.

As a retired Nurse it was nice to be able to help others in some way during such a difficult time."

By the time she had finished, Sally had completed 30 trousers and 35 tops and a further 20 bags and 10 scrub hats that were rapidly distributed for use by the NHS staff including ambulance staff and carers across the county.

Reflecting on her mother's achievements, daughter Eloise commented "I and all the members of our family, together I'm sure with everyone who knows her here in North Runcton, just want to say how proud we are of her."



# Reopening of Churches in The Benefice of Middlewinch

The following key points were agreed at a meeting on Wednesday 15 July to discuss reopening of churches, schedule of services, and services to be offered.

### **Reopening of Churches**

- Both East Winch and North Runcton churches had welcomed people for private prayer which was encouraging and positive. However, the exact numbers were unknown.
- ➤ For online prerecording, the members have been informed 92 subscribers to the on-line service with almost 100% positive responses and all agreed that the weekly on-line services should continue for the time being, with numbers being reviewed.
- North Runcton would like to continue with a private prayer for the time being, as this was a relatively new initiative, and not everyone was aware of it. Further advertising would help.

#### Schedule of Services

- ➤ All agreed it was important to open one church in the Benefice for public worship. At the suggestion of a member of Ministry team, the Middleton church was chosen as it was the largest and could be adapted more easily for social distancing (i.e. oneway system) and accommodate more people. There was also better parking, reasonably flat access, together with handwashing and toilet facilities.
- Although the Rev. Riaz and his family had made a start on cleaning and preparing the church, further work would be required.
- A suggestion was made to have a combined PCC to oversee the services. The Rector said he would discuss this further with Diocesan Officers and report back.
- For future weekly on-line services, it was hoped that representatives from each of the parishes would take part. From West Winch, two members had expressed their interest and the churchwarden of NR

- would check out volunteers from North
- ➤ It was agreed to continue to follow the Lectionary readings and that the content needs to be kept simple and concise.

  Shaun (churchwarden EW) said that all content has to be received by Friday each week. It was agreed to number the services for reference purposes.
- Thanks were expressed to Shaun (churchwarden EW) for all the hard work involved in putting this together.

#### Services to be offered in Middleton Church

# Sunday 16 August at 10.30 am. Morning Service

- ➤ Short, 30-minute service. No singing allowed but could use CD player. It is possible to have a one-page service sheet placed in the pews in advance, with members of the congregation instructed to take it away with them at the end of the service. No refreshments available. Names of those attending should be recorded. Further discussion is required on service content.
- Sunday 6 September Harvest Festival with Holy Communion.
- Sunday 27 September on the theme of St Michael and all angels
- Special Note: On each of these Sundays i.e. 16th August, 6th and 27th September East Winch and North Runcton would not be open for private prayer and would change this to a different day, possibly Saturday. East Winch could move theirs to the Wednesday.
- ➤ The on-line service would continue to be produced for these Sundays as it could be viewed at any time.

#### **Next Steps**

➤ A working party would be required to prepare the church for the services. It would be helpful to have two volunteers from each parish making 8 in total. Half to prepare beforehand and half afterwards. A meeting was arranged for 3:00 pm on Saturday 15 August.

- ➤ The Rector requested that for any matters relating to Middleton Church he should be contacted and members were asked to remember Middleton Parish in their prayers.
- Details would be placed in the Parish Magazines and Ken suggested including something in the Lynn News.

#### **Any Other Business**

- Amanda Hart (EW) would like to include something for children on the YouTube service. Her suggestion was for a colouring sheet for the children in East Winch, with the best one being featured. The children could then access YouTube to see the chosen picture. The colouring sheets could be left for collection at the local Post Office. All agreed this was a good idea.
- ➤ The Rector suggested a story writing challenge for young people. This could be the Bible or Christian-based or from any point of view. This would help to maintain contact with them.


