The subject of the talk by Neil Glenn is Birding the Arctic Circle, especially in Spring where species which winter in Britain and breed in Finland and Norway can be encountered. The talk features speciality species of the far north and photos by professional photographers such as Jari Peltomakki.

# EAST WINCH PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

#### 16 MAY 2023

At the Annual Parish Meeting, Mr Mel Place was re-appointed as Chair of Council for 2023/24, and Mr Alan Yarham was re-appointed as Vice Chair. The Chairman's report for 2022/23 and Parish Council Finances for the year ending 31 March 2023 were given. A report from the United Charities for East Winch and West Bilney for the year ending 31 December 2022 was received. But, disappointingly, annual reports had not been received from East Winch and West Bilney Parish Church, from the Village Hall Trustees, or from the Friends of East Winch and West Bilney.

At the subsequent Parish Council meeting, Borough Councillor Michael De Whalley reported that he and Bal Anota had been returned as Councillors for Gayton and Grimston Ward in the recent election and that Jim Moriarty had been re-elected as the County Councillor for Gayton and Nar Valley. Cllr De Whalley updated the Council on developments with the Borough Council's Local Development Plan (best known for the issues relating to the proposed housing developments in West Winch).

Parish Council is very disappointed and frustrated by the failure of Norfolk County Council Highways to fulfil the contract to complete the building of the pedestrian Trod to the Post Office. At present the uncompleted Trod ends at a dangerous position on a blind bend, and there are suggestions that a second additional and unbudgeted-for funding supplement would be required from the Parish Council in order for Highways to finish the job. Parish Council is taking up the issue with County Councillor Jim Moriarty, who is fully supportive and is putting our case very strongly to the County Council.

#### 4 JULY 2023

Borough Councillor Michael De Whalley reported on the Independent Partnership coalition arrangements now in place at the Borough Council after the local election in May. Under these arrangements, Cllr Jim Moriarty is Deputy Leader, Cllr De Whalley is Cabinet Member for Climate Change and Biodiversity, and Cllr Bal Anota is Cabinet Member for Property and Corporate Services.

Parishioners raised concerns about the proposed re-siting of a bus-shelter on the A47 opposite the Carpenter's Arms as part of National Highways' very lengthy and disruptive safety works, and they felt their concerns were not being heard by the appropriate authorities. Parish Council will convey these concerns to County Councillor, Jim Moriarty.

Parishioners also raised concerns about the excessive noise coming from the parties held on the Adrian Flux site at East Winch Hall on three occasions in June. Parishioners said that the loud music from the parties, which were held in an outdoor marquee, continued well past midnight and showed a complete lack of regard for their neighbours in the village. ### **News from North Runcton**

### **West Winch Growth Area**

Members of North Runcton and West Winch Parish Councils attended a stakeholders meeting on 17th July. This was notable because the new BCKLWN administration is now in post and the meeting was chaired by Cllr Moriarty.

The West Winch scheme is a key part of the Local Plan presently under review and the examiners have requested more evidence from BCKLWN to show that the West Winch Growth Area plan is 'sound' in sustainable planning terms. The meeting was told that this evidence has been submitted – but will not be in the public domain until August.

It was indicated that the Hopkins Homes outline application for 1100 homes would go to the planning committee this autumn. Assuming it is granted, a reserved matters application for the first 300 houses and a new roundabout on the A10 would likely be submitted by March 2024.

Officers warned that if the outline scheme was refused it would most likely win at appeal due to the site being allocated (see Knight's Hill). The most likely construction programme would see house building start in 2026, with first completions in 2027. The first phase of 300 homes might be completed by March 2031.

There is no news on funding for the 'relief road' and the planning application has not yet been submitted. Officers emphasised their view that planning consent for the housing is necessary to illustrate that the road will give value by delivering housing. This seems to overlook the vagaries of the economy and house prices, which will surely be the main influence on the rate of future housing delivery.

In hindsight, the die was really cast when BCKLWN adopted their 'Core Strategy' in 2011 proposing that King's Lynn should expand into West Winch – seemingly without real scrutiny or a full appreciation of the likely requirements or impacts of that decision. Development of this size and scale is unusual in Norfolk and one can only really hope that the inevitable disbenefits (loss of countryside, large new population, greatly increased road and traffic impacts) will be outweighed by the benefits (new amenities, improved infrastructure, enhanced quality of life).

Many locals seem to remain sceptical that the benefits will come. Most of the amenities we

would like (surgery, dentist, community rooms, convenience stores, cycle paths, public open space) are not set in stone and will need to be fought for over coming years and decades.

These are legitimate concerns even before we consider the adjustments that must be made to our community to mitigate the impact of the climate crisis. It is hard to imagine that the West Winch Growth Area, if first proposed today, would be considered the most sustainable way to grow King's Lynn and West Norfolk.

North Runcton Parish Council is proposing to write again in regard to the two planning applications that are already submitted. These are the Hopkins outline scheme for 1100 house (Ref 13-01615-OM) and the Metacre outline scheme for 500 (Ref 18-02289-OM).

#### **Ticks**

Ticks are becoming more common in Norfolk. For those of you who haven't met one – they are a small blood-sucking arachnid that climbs grass or other plants and waits for a passing animal. They then use hooks on their front legs to hang on to clothes or fur and use their mouthparts to stab through the skin. In my experience they seem to like hairy legs!

As they grow from a larvae (1mm?) to nymph to adult (3-4mm) they may bite several animals, feed and then drop off. This is where the main concern arises because they can spread bloodborne diseases, in particular Lyme disease, which can be very serious if untreated.

You can usually remove a tick with a pinch between forefinger and thumb nails for small ones – but a tick remover (most pharmacies) is advised for large or engorged ticks. Watch the bite for reaction. If a circular rash appears within days – seek medical advice. You may need antibiotics.

We have had a few reports of ticks in North Runcton this summer – it may be related to the burgeoning local population of deer. Ticks may arrive in your house via cats and dogs and the dog tick (recently introduced to the UK) is said to be able to survive for sometime in houses. Be aware!



### Running my last-ever Marathon at 75

My name is Stewart South from Blackborough End and I have decided at the grand old age of 75 that the Yorkshire Marathon on 15th October will be my last. It will be my eighth marathon and I shall be fundraising for Kidney Research UK - I hope you can sponsor me. As my body is creaking a bit it will be my final 26.2 mile event; after that I will only run much shorter distances.

Way back I hadn't planned to run any marathons at all. But then our son Joel suffered kidney failure, resulting in me donating a kidney to him in 1999. Following that surgery I realised I needed to get fit again and I decided to run the 2002 London Marathon, and to raise money for Kidney Research UK in the process. Meanwhile, our other son



Oliver also suffered kidney failure. He had a kidney transplant in 2002, and so the marathons and the fundraising kept coming. I have now run marathons in London, twice, New York, Dublin, Edinburgh, Amsterdam and, during Covid, a 'virtual' London Marathon. This October's event will take place in the historic city of York.

This year I have run some 5K (3 mile) parkruns, completed the King's Lynn GEAR 10K (6 miles) and run the Sandringham Half Marathon (13.1 miles), the latter in blistering heat and energy-sapping humidity. I am also doing solo training runs, steadily building up the distances. The great Olympian Sir Mo Farah retired from marathon running this year at the age of 40, but I didn't actually start running marathons until my mid-fifties!

Both our sons are in their forties now and Joel had a second kidney transplant two years ago. There are all sorts of issues and complications that have to be overcome with kidney failure, even if you are fortunate enough to have a transplant. Thankfully, our sons live their lives pretty normally, although they have had some difficult times. Kidney Research UK says: "Over 3 million people in the UK are living with the severe stages of kidney disease. Treatments can be gruelling and currently there is no cure. Only research will end this and nobody can do it but us, by offering kidney patients and their families hope for the future."

# TIME TO VISIT TRUE'S YARD



On Saturday 10 June, the North Runcton Parochial Church Council hosted a Community Hour in All Saints' Church. The guest speaker was the eminent King's Lynn historian, Dr Paul Richards and he had been given a very wide brief for his subject matter by Church Warden, Ken Matthews: "The Connections twixt North Runcton, King's Lynn and the surrounding Villages".

Those of you that attended will have witnessed Dr Richards deliver a hugely entertaining and interesting talk. You will doubtless have learned something about the area that hitherto you did not know.

During his talk Dr Richards mentioned that he was the Chairman of the Trustees of True's Yard Fisherfolk Museum. As I am a "Friend" of and Volunteer at True's Yard, this prompted me to reflect on my decade or more of association with the King's Lynn area. During this time, I have only discovered a handful of local residents who have visited True's Yard, many of whom are in their later years and have spent most or all of their lives here.

The Museum is really a gem of our historical past hiding in plain sight. These days folks visiting King's Lynn often look for St Nicholas Chapel but, as it is invariably closed presumably because of a lack of volunteers, do not venture any further along St Anne's Street to the junction of North Street where the Museum is located.

I would encourage anyone who has not visited True's Yard to do so. And those who may have visited but some time ago would be pleasantly surprised at how the Museum has evolved. Perhaps some background might be helpful. The Fisherfolk Museum is an independent Museum which tells that story of the lost fishing community of the North End of King's Lynn. Visiting the Cottages, the Old Smithy, Smokehouse, and the fishing smack activity you can open a window into King's Lynn's maritime and social heritage.

The Old North End was swept away by slum clearances and road building in the 1930s and 1960s. But its spirit is captured in this last remaining yard, saved for posterity in the 1990s and opened by His Majesty King Charles III, then the Prince of Wales. Another remarkable survival is the Victorian Smokehouse which is the only remaining smokehouse in King's Lynn.

Herring caught in the Wash would have been smoked here on speats over oak chippings. (A speat is a regional term for a rod on which the fish were hung).

# £86m investment in three new diagnostic centres to be built at region's hospitals

People across Norfolk and Waveney will be able to have imaging faster and earlier diagnoses thanks to three new diagnostic centres set to be built in the region over the next two years.

One of the new facilities will be based at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital King's Lynn.

Each of the sites will house MRI and CT scanners as well as X-ray and Ultrasound imaging. These are used for diagnosis and monitoring of a very wide range of conditions, including cancer, heart disease, stroke, respiratory diseases, trauma, musculoskeletal diseases, neurology and, most recently, COVID-19. To help deliver the scans, there will be more staff recruited including radiographers, radiologists and support staff.

### RSPCA EAST WINCH WILDLIFE CENTRE



### OPEN DAY SUNDAY, 27 AUGUST 10AM TO 4PM

Visitors will have a rare chance to see behind the scenes at the wildlife hospital, speak with staff and take a sneaky peek at some of the animals.

The centre used to hold an open day once every two years, but has not hosted one since 2017 due to the pandemic, so this really is a rare opportunity for visitors to see and learn more about what happens inside a busy working RSPCA wildlife hospital.

As well as the chance to find out more about what goes on behind the scenes there will also be 50 stalls including hot food, produce and local crafts - there will also be raffles, tombolas, games, demonstrations and much more.

Refreshments will be available.

RSPCA Centre manager Evangelos Achilleos said: "We are really excited to be hosting our first Open Day for quite some time! During the event visitors will have the opportunity to see what goes on behind certain parts of the hospital doors and meet with our vets and staff and find out about the variety of rehabilitation work we do for the wildlife in our care.

"The public will be able to see seal feeds through the visitor centre, and our intermediate pools, they will be able to enter our veterinary examination rooms, speak to vets and vet nurses on animal care, see X-rays and skeletons, see our staff weigh geese and ducks and also see staff feeding animals through windows in our orphan corridor. We will have a hedgehog trail, wildlife raffle, and lots of educational stands on wildlife care, to include seal entanglements, where you will get to see first hand the materials seals have been caught in along the coast. (Animals that can be seen are subject to the patients we have in at the time).

"Local people are so supportive of our centre and they are constantly visiting us with injured wildlife, and the open days are a chance for them to find out exactly what happens to the animals once they have been left with the RSPCA staff and volunteers.

"While we have to ensure that contact between the wildlife and humans is minimum, we now have a set of CCTV cameras set up around the hospital which means we can show more of the work we do, without disturbing the animals."

Staff will be on hand at various points at the centre to talk through the work we do with all the different species of wildlife they care for.

The open day will run from 10am until 4pm. Entry is £5 per car, or £5 family of 5 (cash is preferred for the entry fee only).

Parking is free. No dogs, except assistance dogs.







### NEW HOSTS SOUGHT FOR UKRAINIAN FAMILIES ACROSS NORFOLK

Norfolk County Council are looking for new hosts to join the hundreds of other Norfolk residents who have opened their homes and provided accommodation for a family or individuals from Ukraine.

The Homes for Ukraine scheme was launched in March 2022 to provide support to Ukraine following the Russian invasion in February 2022. The war in Ukraine has now entered its second year, and the need for support and compassion for those displaced by the conflict has not changed. We are still in need of people to host Ukrainian families; especially for guests who have been in Norfolk for a while now and are needing to move for employment, education or other reasons.

Cllr Margaret Dewsbury, cabinet member for communities and partnerships, said: "I'm really proud of our county and how quickly our residents responded to the call for help. Over 800 households have so far welcomed a guest, but we still need more hosts to come forward. In particular, we are looking for people who can help house families, so if you've got space, please get in touch with the team to find out more."

A range of ongoing support is on offer for hosts, including a monthly thank you payment of £500. Hosts also get support with all safeguarding and accommodation checks from Norfolk County Council, alongside our district, borough, city councils and voluntary sector partners. Information packs are available to help hosts with the settling-in period and provide information on the practical steps that guests will need help with, like setting up a bank account and finding work.

Throughout the time guests live with hosts, we also conduct welfare visits to support everyone to help make the hosting arrangement successful and rewarding. Once guests are ready to move on, either into their own accommodation or to return to Ukraine, we have a range of practical support and services available to help this go smoothly.

Mary, who lives in Wretham, hosts a family from Ukraine. Alya who has 2 children came to the UK in April 2022. Mary supported Alya and her family to get their children into school and is hoping to host the family until the children have finished their schooling. The oldest child will then go onto college to study.

"The experience has been really rewarding," Mary said. "There is so much support on offer when you become a host, and I'd encourage anyone who is considering offering accommodation to get in touch with Norfolk County Council to see what's involved. The thank you payment is nice, but the whole process is worth far more to me than that. You get to help people in real need and see that you are making a difference to their lives - I'm so glad that I signed up!"

Maureen, who lives in Watton, responded to the call for hosts straight away, offering her spare room to Nadia, a 22-year-old from Ukraine, where she had an apartment and a good job. Her family are still in Ukraine, west of the capital. Using her background in vocational education, Maureen helped Nadia successfully apply for a job, and after being hosted for a number of months, Nadia now lives independently.

"The whole process has been so rewarding," Maureen said. "I'd encourage anyone to register their interest if they have space to become a host. You get a real feel-good factor that you're helping someone in need; it can be a mutually satisfying experience."
