#### **News from North Runcton**

West Winch Growth Area: Some of you might have heard that at their meeting on November 13th the Borough Council cabinet supported the *Infrastructure Delivery Plan* for the West Winch Growth Area. This document has concluded that the proposed development in this area can be viably delivered in coming decades. The assessment supposedly includes for all the provisions of the Local Plan and Neighbourhood Plan.

The Borough now propose to submit their own outline planning application for the Growth Area (except the Hopkins Homes site adjacent the A47 - see below). This unusual step is being proposed as a way of achieving a more integrated approach to future delivery.

It is understood that a *South East King's Lynn Delivery Group* will be set up (comprising the Borough Council, Norfolk County Council, landowners/developers and parish councils) to co-ordinate the preparation and submission of a masterplan, outline planning application and associated processes. At the time of writing the Parish Councils have not been consulted about this – but we are keeping the phone lines clear!

Hopkins Homes Site: The northern portion of the Growth Area is allocated for 1100 houses, school and local centre and was the subject of an outline application by Hopkins Homes in 2013 (13/01615/OM). It is expected that this application may now be determined in early 2019. A number of new plans and documents were submitted to the Borough in October and can be seen on the Borough planning site. North Runcton Parish Council will be submitting comments on the plans – which indicate a phased delivery over 15 years.

**SDA Campsite**: We understand that contractors have completed construction of a new access road to the site from the Blackborough End road, and that all construction traffic to the site will now use this route. Parish Council and SDA representatives plan to meet to discuss remaining issues.

<u>Village traffic</u>: The Parish Council have been analysing data from the Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) that records the speed and volume of

traffic on New Road and Rectory Lane. Unsurprisingly, peak times for traffic flow are between 8.00/9.00am and 5.00/6.00pm when vehicle flow is anything up to 120 vehicles per hour on New Road with the remainder of the day seeing around 60 vehicles per hour travelling through the village on both routes. Daily traffic volumes on both roads tend to vary between 800 and 1800 vehicles a day.

In terms of the speed of vehicles travelling through the village, most motorists are travelling between 30 and 35mph, but around 20% are exceeding the speed limit by anything up to 15mph. The pattern of speeding is pretty consistent throughout the day so it is not just commuters who are speeding. **Residents! Please drive considerately!** 

If this is an issue that concerns you - and you would be interested in being part of a *Community Speed Watch Group*, please let a Parish Councillor know, and we can consider setting one up.

# DEBUT NOVEL FOR EAST WINCH AUTHOR

After a long gestation period, East Winch author Ali Carter has just published her first novel.

The title of the book is 'Blood List'. The plot hits straight at the heart of a small town community with its deeply unsettling antagonist, who on the face of it



everyone should be able to trust. Think the Lake District is a nice place to visit? Think again. Ali Carter has created a female Dr. Shipman in her debut thriller - and the bodies just keep on coming...

Ali said:

"The Harold Shipman case at the end of the nineties/early 2000's really fascinated me, but I always wondered if, how and why a woman could have done something similar – I wanted to flip the gender. The bookshelves are full of aggressive male antagonists; I wanted to write about a mad, bad and dangerous to know anti-heroine, of the coldest and hardest variety"

Deeply buried psychological issues haunt G.P. Charlotte Peterson from her youth; a philandering doctor husband, and a past adversary who turns up in her small Cumbrian town just add to her paranoia. She's already extremely edgy, heavily self medicating and the newcomer's arrival is a stark reminder of a bitter and very dark time she'd rather forget. The questions are – will she succumb to a burning desire to destroy this person, and who will be able to stop her toppling right over the edge?' The clock is ticking and the Lakes are deep.

Ali Carter was born in Surrey in 1958 and moved to East Anglia in 2003, eventually settling in East Winch where she lives with her husband, 5 dogs and 6 cats (Yes she knows the dog/cat thing is a bit mad!). She originally found some success in writing poetry in the 80's and 90's, but inspiration for 'Blood List' came after the Shipman trial hit the headlines in January 2000. A few years later, Charlotte Peterson, a deeply psychotic Cumbrian G.P. was born. The full story took its time to complete however, as 10 years of writer's block appeared three quarters of the way through. It was an author friend who finally persuaded her to pull it out of the laptop and finish it, for which she remains eternally grateful. A sequel is in its infancy, and she sincerely

hopes it won't take another 12 years to come to fruition!

**Blood List** was published on 28 November (£8.99 - Matador - ISBN 9781789015706) and is available from all good high street bookshops and on line retailers.

# Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

In my previous report I made reference to the situation regarding the telephone box at Blackborough End. The Parish Council (PC) discussed the possibility of installing a defibrillator in the box as required by Community Heartbeat. After much discussion it was agreed that the PC would not purchase a defibrillator, reason being:

- (a) Without proper training there was a possibility that the patient could suffer more damage resulting in a fatality.
- (b) The remoteness of the telephone box to the rest of the parish.
- (c) The defibrillator could be subject to vandalism.

After discussions with Norfolk County Council (NCC) Water Management it was agreed that the PC can install a trash filter in the dyke at The Alley. A licence to install the filter is in the process of being applied for.

The PC was given a report from the Speed Watch as it is six months since it has been running and in that time 549 people have been caught speeding. As previously stated the majority were local residents. What is most worrying is some lorries have been caught doing 50 mph down Station Road.

Prior to the November meeting of the PC the Parish Clerk met with Highways and went around the parish pointing out all the problems that have been previously reported. The PC await the outcome of the meeting.

The problem of lorries using Hill Road at unsociable hours was discussed. A letter from Sibelco had been received but this offered no solution to the problem. Representatives from the PC will attend the next Sibelco liaison meeting to discuss this matter to see if a solution can be arrived at. One suggestion is that there could be restricted hours for lorries coming to the plant.

The Borough Councillor reported that he has recently attended a meeting at Hunstanton where ideas were discussed to revitalise the town. One of the ideas is reinstating the rail link between King's Lynn and Hunstanton, to this end there is an on line petition which people are asked to take part in.



After many months of pounding the roads and lanes of West Norfolk and much further afield - I am delighted to report that I have at last successfully completed my 'Seven at Seventy' running challenges, as well as my fundraising objectives.

I am deeply grateful to so many of you from our local communities for your generous donations. Together with sponsors from elsewhere you have raised a total of £2300 for my charities - that is £300 more than my target. All this money is being split between Kidney Research UK and a kidney research project at Addenbrooke's Hospital.

#### CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM REV'D. RIAZ

"You and Saviour"! Luke 2:10

**'You'!** In the reference God is saying that He is giving 'you' something special. #### MIDDLETON COMMEMORATES ARMISTICE CENTENARY

Over the weekend of 10 and 11 November, Middleton played its part in the historic national commemorations to mark the centenary of the end of the First World War.

#### MIDDLETON REMEMBERS

In the days leading up to the centenary, a dozen large poppies were installed at key points around the village. The metal poppies were made and donated by Arc Fabrications thanks to the generosity of Val Ward and Geoff Smith.



## THANK YOU FOR THE KNITTED POPPIES

The appeal for knitted poppies to decorate the Church and the exhibition produced a fantastic response. A massive Thank You to everyone who contributed to the very impressive total of over 1,300 knitted or crocheted poppies that were received.





The poppies were incorporated into "cascades" of poppies decorating the pulpit and the font in the church, as well as at the entrance to the church and the pew ends. As the photos illustrate, the effect was dramatic and highly praised by everyone who visited the church over the remembrance weekend.





#### TRIBUTE TO THE FALLEN

In the early planning stages for the commemorations, it was decided that there should be a handcrafted centenary tribute to the men of the parish who lost their lives in the war. Janet Eason and Alison South kindly agreed to take the lead on designing and making the tribute.

The tribute was unveiled by Ali South (pictured left) and Janet Eason (pictured right) on the Saturday morning and is now on permanent display in the church.

The main theme of the tribute is a poppy for each of the thirty men named on the Middleton War Memorial, with their names recorded on a panel to the right. On the left is the famous poem "In Flanders Fields" by John McCrae. The calligraphy was prepared by Jan and Ali's art group colleague, Gillian Thompson.

#### THE EXHIBITION

Chris Dixon organised the exhibition, featuring World War 1 artefacts which he has collected over the years.




#### REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

In spite of many requests, the Council has heard nothing from the Norfolk Highways Department, though there are several outstanding matters. We will continue to pursue them.


