# East Winch Parish Council Meeting 1st November 2021

Both the Borough and County Councillors attended.

A member of the public brought up the problem of the dyke in front of Station Terrace, as silt is again blocking the grid and slowing down the flow. Cllr Moriarty said he'd speak to Andrew Wallace of NCC Highways.

He later reported that Highways will clear the grid, and that Mr Wallace had suggested that grid clearance should be a permanent item on the Rangers' agenda. (This has been suggested previously, but did not produce results.)

Mr Wallace is also to be asked whether more 30 mph signs could be put up in the village to remind drivers accelerating on Gayton Rd in particular.

Cllr Manning said Borough councillors had £1000 each for good causes not arranged by the Parish Council. Something for the Friends of East Winch to apply for, perhaps?

The Borough Council's consideration of planning matters is very, very slow at present. Several applications around the village are outstanding. The Ashwicken Eco-Wellness project has been put back to 31 December 2021 for consideration. Comment can still be made.

The PC considered a recent planning applications, and recommended refusal. They objected to the application for a large annex to Church farm, West Bilney on the grounds that the A47 is fast and visibility restricted there.

The next meeting will be at 7.30 on Monday, 10th January. Happy new year!

# Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

#### The closure of Water Lane to vehicles

The PC received a letter asking if Water Lane could be closed to vehicles enabling people to walk safely. The PC discussed this and agreed that it is dangerous trying to walk on thaw lane due to blind bends, no pavements, speeding vehicles and vehicles going the wrong way. The PC need to assess whether this would be wanted by all the residents in Water Lane.

#### **A47**

Various safety issues have been raised. Jim Moriarty will arrange a meeting with relevant parties and representatives of the PC will attend to see if we can move things forward. Various suggestions have been put forward by residents.

Also, it is felt that the Station Road turning onto the A47 is dangerous as when the lorries turn they have to drive onto the wrong side of the road. The concerns were taken on board but we have heard nothing further.

#### **Trees**

The PC are still looking for volunteers to help with planting the saplings on the playing field.

#### **Platinum Jubilee**

The PC are also still looking for help and suggestions for the Jubilee. Unfortunately at the time of writing, we haven't received any offers of help, or any suggestions. The PC will not be able to organise anything without some help from residents, so please get in touch.

#### Playing field

Goalposts have been requested by some of the local children. The PC are looking into costs for this with the help of Councillor Ward.

#### Remembrance Sunday

On Sunday the 14th November I laid a wreath on behalf of the PC for Remembrance Sunday. The service was at West Winch so the wreath was laid there, and then brought back to Middleton to remain at the Middleton Church Memorial. Lest we forget.

#### **Planning**

The PC did raise an objection to the planning application 21/01484/O, three dwellings at land opposite 1-3 Two Acres. It was previously refused by the PC and upheld by the Inspector, and is outside the village envelope and the PC could see no reason to change their opinion and will put forward their objection. The PC have received a number of letters of objection, but it is Important that residents put forward individual objection letters to the BCKLWN.

Comments were made about trenches being dug across Norfolk to supply power from wind farms. This will be on the agenda next month as it needs careful perusal.

In other news Peter Gidney reported that the consultation for the Borough Council's 2022/2023 Council Tax Support scheme is now open. This can be found at www.west-norfolk.gov.uk/ctsconsultation.



### **GOVERNMENT RESPONDS TO QUEEN ELIZABETH HOSPITAL PETITION**

The Government's initial response to this petition, which currently has about 15,000 signatures, did not adequately address the substance of the petition and so a revised response was issued on 20 October.

The key section of the revised response says:

"Currently, the national programme comprises 8 pre-existing schemes and 40 new hospitals, totalling 48 hospitals. In October 2020, the government named 32 hospitals which will form part of the 40 new hospitals and is now calling for NHS trusts to submit their expressions of interest to be one of the next 8 hospitals.

Expressions of interest were invited from all NHS trusts in England who would like their plans to be considered for prioritisation of funding for a new hospital, including from Queen Elizabeth Hospital, King's Lynn. The submission deadline has now passed and we aim to announce the successful schemes in spring 2022, following a thorough selection process.

This selection process will also inform the ongoing pipeline of investment through this programme, subject to future funding settlements. It would not be appropriate to prioritise King's Lynn, QEH, or any other hospital out with that formal process or prematurely pre-judging it at this stage."

The response also noted that to help address the immediate issues at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital estate, more than £20 million has been provided this year and the Trust has also received £750,000 to prioritise and tackle its most urgent maintenance backlog.

#### **Help the RSPCA East Winch Wildlife Centre Care for Hedgehogs**

So far the centre has 117 hedgehogs in their care - but the numbers continue to increase daily and now centre manager Evangelos Achilleos is asking the people of Norfolk to help.

He said: "They need regular feeding and as a result we are asking if the public could donate tins of adult dog food (Pedigree) as well as old newspapers as we get through incredible amounts each week caring for our prickly friends. We also have a list of other items on our Amazon wishlist which all help in the care of our hoglets."

"The hedgehogs are being admitted for a whole host of reasons but most are predominantly orphans who are underweight or have been found out during the day - many are very malnourished."

"Nursing them back to health is a lengthy process and very time consuming but it's always worth it when you can return a hedgehog back to the wild where they belong."

# New Norfolk RSPCA wildlife manager is a self-confessed 'bird geek'

There's a new face at RSPCA's East Winch Wildlife Centre as Evangelos Achilleos takes up the helm as centre manager.



Evangelos joined the RSPCA in September and since then has been busy getting to know the staff and of course all of the animals under his care.

Evangelos, who has a long career in wildlife conservation work said: "I have a real passion for wildlife conservation and education and I have to admit I am also a bird geek who has a soft spot for owls."

"I have been spending the last few years taking holidays in Norfolk and I adore the setting, the wilderness, the coastline and the wildlife."

"I am so excited to be joining the East Winch family, surrounded by a strong team and of course all our wildlife patients. I am eager to further develop the already successful wildlife centre with the staff and the community."

Evangelos takes on the role after Alison Charles retired earlier this year following a long and successful career at the centre.

Evangelos, who has a degree in Animal Management, a Masters in Animal Welfare and Conservation, and is currently completing a PhD part time in Avian Conservation and Genetics, added: "The wildlife centre is a great asset to the community. The team does so much

wonderful work helping to rehabilitate the animals and releasing them back to the wild where they belong."

"I want to build on this success and hope to, in the future, develop our visitor centre so we have a visitor shop and offer educational packages we can share with the community.

"We are also looking for Norfolk wildlife artists, to volunteer their time and skills to help us rejuvenate our visitor centre and help us produce a wildlife mural. #### **North Runcton News**

For better or worse the Parish Council have been holding public meetings since June (as instructed by NALC) – but the pandemic is not over. More people seem to be catching covid and even if you are double vaccinated, it seems to knock people down for a week or more. Mask wearing is still a good idea! Wash hands regularly! Avoid large indoor gatherings where possible!

Planning: A meeting of the 'West Winch Growth Area Delivery Stakeholder Group' was held on 1st November, attended by Cllrs from both West Winch, North Runcton and Middleton Parish Councils. It is fair to say that progress on the development remains slow. (Have we said that before?!)

The latest milestone dates being touted are that BCKLWN will undertake public consultation in spring 2022 on a masterplan for the whole site and a design for the 'relief road'. It is then intended that those schemes will be submitted for planning later in 2022. If everything went to plan BCKLWN officers envisage construction of the road starting in 2024 and taking around 2 years.

Meanwhile the outline application for 1100 homes and a school submitted by Hopkins Homes in 2013 is still to be determined. It has been suggested that consent may be granted as early as next spring (ie before the consultation of the masterplan and road design is complete – which seems wrong?). You can of course review the application (and 470+ documents) on the planning portal (reference number 13/01615/OM).

Regarding funding for the road – this is still not in place. One would hope that new Government funding for any major infrastructure will have increasingly stringent requirements for environmental sustainability, and on that basis you have to question whether a large, roaddependent housing estate can tick those boxes.

It was proposed that BCKLWN will commence press release updates about the scheme on behalf of the Stakeholder Group. It is probably worth noting in advance that these may or may not reflect the views of the attending Parish Councillors!

Offshore Energy: As you may know, several more offshore windfarms are proposed in the North Sea. North Runcton PC have joined over 70 other Norfolk Parish Councils to ask the Government to coordinate the onshore connections for that energy, because at present there is no need for the individual companies to coordinate. This means that each scheme may result in a wide corridor of destruction across rural Norfolk to connect to the National Grid. It is extraordinary that there appears to be no overall direction from Government to minimise the impact of these schemes.

The North Runcton Conservation Volunteers met for the first time in over a year for a session at Sheep's Course Wood on 30th October.

Around 10 volunteers worked for a couple of hours with refreshments provided. We cleared nettles around young trees and hedge plants that had been planted previously. Plants that had not survived were identified and the protection tubes and stakes removed. The entrance to the wood was also cleared as a fallen tree was restricting access. Thanks particularly to Paula for the refreshments.

On the 6th November we also planted around 1000 more spring bulbs on Church Green, filling in some gaps from previous years. Many thanks to all those who helped. We may have more meets over the winter to survey, put up owl boxes and to litter pick.
