EAST WINCH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 8 NOVEMBER

When Mr Paul Twite, the General Manager of Adrian Flux, attended our previous meeting in September, he said that Adrian Flux would be pleased to engage with the Parish Council on any issues that would be of assistance to the community. As a result, the company has now kindly agreed to undertake the work previously done by the village handyman (clean and maintain the village benches and the ground around them, clean the bus shelter, keep the telephone box tidy and repaint when necessary, cut the playing field grass and keep the ground clear of rubbish, keep the village sign site tidy, generally look throughout the village and clear rubbish when necessary).

Under the 10 Minute Open Forum for Parishioners, the Parish Council heard that an application for a Whole Woodland Tree Preservation Order (TPO) was to be submitted for the woodlands on land at Pentney Woods. The Parish Council welcomed this development as it had previously objected to a planning application (21/01824/FM) for a change of use of those woodlands to a holiday and recreation site. We asked the Parish Council Clerk to write to the Borough Council's Arboricultural Officer to ask for an update on the progress of the TPO as councillors were fully supportive of the application.

Norfolk County Council Highways has informed the Parish Council that the completion of the pedestrian Trod on Gayton Road, from the old railway to the Post Office, will cost an additional £37,000, of which the Parish Council's contribution is expected to be in the region of £10,000.

The Parish Council very much regretted this further additional call on its resources over and above the original quotation it was given; however we considered that it would be entirely unacceptable to leave the Trod uncompleted where it currently ends at a dangerous position on a blind bend.

On that basis we agreed to fund the completion of the Trod. With support from Councillor Jim Moriarty, assurances will be sought from Highways that the drainage issues at that point on the Gayton Road will be resolved and that there will be no further time slippage or cost overruns on this project.

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held in East Winch Village Hall on Tuesday 9 January 2024, beginning at 7.30pm. Please come along.

NORTH RUNCTON NEWS

West Winch Growth Area (WWGA)

It will not be entirely surprising to local residents if we report that in the last few months there has been little significant planning progress for the West Winch Growth Area.

County Council officers have indicated that the 'business case' submitted to obtain funding for the West Winch 'relief road' has been well received by the Department of Transport. However, despite the Government recently announcing their support for more road building, it is unclear when or if they will support this project. It may depend on party politics as we approach the election season.

We were also told that the outline planning application for the 'Hopkins' site (Ref 13/01615/OM - 1100 houses and primary school), which was originally submitted more than 10 years ago, would go to the planning committee before the end of this year. But at time of writing, a date is yet to be confirmed.

Meanwhile, we also await new dates for the Local Plan Examination hearings to open. Consultation on new reports and evidence requested by the examiners ended in October. Matters that related directly to the West Winch growth area included new reviews of landscape impact, biodiversity impact, drainage proposals and transport figures. In general, we felt that the additional evidence failed to propose exactly what mitigation would be implemented to reduce the very obvious adverse impacts of such a large urban extension.

Nevertheless, both West Winch and North Runcton Parish Councils are somewhat resigned to the idea that this scheme will come forward. Therefore, we are now asking for more reassurance that measures that will help to make the development more 'sustainable' are being planned and will be delivered. Provision of a multi-modal transport system that reduces private car use is a key issue. We are therefore pushing for early delivery of infrastructure that will support improved bus services, cycle routes and, potentially, a 'parkway' railway station.

What are you burning?

As the nights get colder many people embrace a solid fuel element to their household heating – whether it be an open fire or a wood burning stove. Sales of stoves are said to have risen by 40% in recent years.

This is certainly evident if you walk around local streets on a still, misty November evening, when, what can only be described as thick 'smog' now regularly seems to envelop our residential areas. After decades when 'smokeless zones' were generally accepted, we seem to be slipping backwards. And studies show that air quality <u>indoors</u> is often as bad as it can be outdoors. A study last year suggested the NHS was saddled with a £0.9billion of health-related problems caused by wood fire burning.

The following advice is recommended.

- Only burn clean wood (avoiding paints, glue bonded materials or plastics)
- Ensure the wood is properly seasoned. (Moisture content should be less than 20%)
- Ensure stoves and chimneys are properly fitted and maintained and that the flue is located to ensure appropriate dispersal of smoke.
- And preferably, minimise the number of days you burn solid fuels!

In all likelihood future legislation will ban wood burning stoves from larger urban areas – and it will be interesting to see how the matter will be addressed in smaller villages and rural areas.

Village Meeting Place quiz night

Thanks to everyone who attended the quiz night on 3rd November. Special thanks to John and Jane for setting the quiz and Laura and Anna for providing the supper. These are a fun evening – but they are also VMP fundraisers – so we also raised over £100. Thank you! The next project will be to fit PV panels in an effort to reduce our electricity running costs. The 4Way Group have been appointed and the work will now take place in February.

North Runcton Conservation Volunteers

Since the last report the North Runcton Conservation Volunteers have held two events. In August a team went to Sheep's Course Wood to clear areas around trees that were planted a few years ago. It was heartening to see some of the trees planted towards the A47 are becoming well established.

During October we held our first litter pick of the winter season, collecting several bags of litter from local road verges – in spite of a wet morning! Many thanks as ever to those who

Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

We have had quite a few residents get in touch regarding the dog waste bins in Water Lane and Wormegay Road being taped off. This was done by the Borough Council as they have decided that they are too large and can hold too much and are risk to manual handling so need replacing with smaller ones. This would be at a cost to the PC, but the RRT - Rapid Relief Team have kindly donated one and the PC have ordered a second one. These have now arrived and will be fitted soon.

A number of residents have got in touch and attended meetings regarding the allotments in The Alley asking why the allotments are being allowed to be used for building work access or for storing building materials. The PC did not give permission for them to be used in this way or for them to be driven over and the allotment holders have been contacted.

The PC noticeboard at the school is falling apart and needs replacing. This one is made of wood and the PC feel it should be replaced with a wooden one as it fits with the look of the school. This is very costly, but we have just had confirmation that this will be paid for by two local organisations. We thank them for this.

By the time this is published I will have laid a wreath on behalf of the Parish Council at the remembrance service on Sunday the 12th of November, and then brought it back to Middleton to leave it on the war memorial in the church yard.

The PC will hold a December meeting on Wednesday, 6 December where there may be a minced pie or two. The PC will not meet in January but will resume meetings in February.

THANK YOU FOR SUPPORTING STEWART'S MARATHONS

Thank you very much dear readers of the Parish News for supporting me so generously for running the Yorkshire Marathon on 15th October. It may seem some time ago now but I am indebted to those of you, from across the three parishes and beyond, for your sponsorship. For this marathon I have raised over £2,100 for Kidney Research UK which will help the charity improve the lives of the 7 million people in the UK suffering from kidney disease.

After all the atrocious weather this autumn it was a great relief to be met with bright, sunny weather on Yorkshire Marathon day, although it was very cold at the start, just 4°C. The marathon route took me through historic York, past the Minster and then into rather hilly countryside. I completed the 26.2 mile course in 4h hours 40 minutes, which I thought was quite good for an oldie.

My marathon running started after our son Joel suffered kidney failure in 1997 and two years later I donated a kidney to him. After the operation I wanted to give something back so I ran the London Marathon for charity in 2002. In that year our other son Oliver had a kidney transplant following his kidney failure, and Joel subsequently had a second kidney transplant in 2021. I have run more marathons intermittently over the years, culminating with my eighth and last-ever 26 miler in October at the age of 75. I shall keep on running shorter distances, but no more marathons! Time to reflect, perhaps, that over the years I have raised around £27,000 for charity through running marathons, of which about £5,000 has gone to Addenbrooke's Hospital and all the rest to Kidney Research UK. But I could not have raised this money without your kind donations this time and on previous occasions.

NEW RULES ON SHINGLES VACCINES

The rules on eligibility for shingles vaccines have recently changed.

If you reach the age of 65 <u>on or after 1</u> <u>September 2023</u>, you now become eligible for the shingles vaccine.

However, if you reached the age of 65 <u>before</u> 1 September 2023, you will continue to have to wait until you reach the age of 70 before becoming eligible for the vaccine.

You're also eligible for the shingles vaccine if you're aged 50 or over and you're at higher risk from shingles because you have a severely weakened immune system.

This includes:

- some people with blood cancer (such as leukaemia or lymphoma)
- some people with HIV or AIDS
- some people who've recently had a stem cell transplant, radiotherapy, chemotherapy or an organ transplant
- people taking certain medicines that severely weaken the immune system

If in doubt, consult your GP surgery.

Shingles is a common condition that causes a painful rash. It can sometimes lead to serious problems such as long-lasting pain, hearing loss or blindness.

You're more likely to get shingles, and it's more likely to cause serious problems, as you get older or if you have a severely weakened immune system.

The shingles vaccine helps to reduce your chances of getting shingles and reduce your chances of getting serious problems if you do get shingles.

Chris's beautiful book will delight all of those with a love for the countryside, farming or wildlife and we can look forward to hearing the stories of how the book came to be written.






