Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

The Parish Council (PC) had been made aware by dog walkers and others that the new owner of the field adjacent to the allotments had fenced the field off and therefore it was no longer open to walkers. The PC have discussed this with the owner and initially a footpath was provide around the field but it appears that this has now been blocked at the Sandy Lane end. Discussions are ongoing to resolve this problem but it is not clear who or why the path has been blocked.

A parishioner reported the felling of oak trees on land adjacent to Water Lane, the Forestry Commission were contacted and confirmed that the amount of timber did not need a felling licence.

The PC were contacted regarding tractors and trailers going through the village and asked if they were subject to the 7.5 tonne limit. This matter had previously been discussed with the Police who confirmed that agricultural equipment is exempt from this restriction.

In my previous report I referred to the trees being planted in the play area. The PC would like to thank Councillors Ward, Wiles Van Dyke, parishioners Duane Wye and Angela Canning who donated the trees and stakes.

The PC were made aware that the coach that ran on Tuesday mornings has stopped running from 24 December 2019. The reason being that the coaches used as Public Service Vehicles must comply with the new law which requires them to have disability access. The relevant coach owner cannot comply with this law and is unwilling to purchase coaches that have this facility. It is hoped that this service will be reinstated in the future with another coach operator.

The PC welcomed Mr Andy Wallace of Norfolk County Council Highways department to its January meeting to discuss various highway issues. The main topic was the junction of Station Road and the A47. This was discussed at great length but it seems although it is

recognized that something needs doing to improve the junction it all comes down to finance at the end of the day. Another matter brought up was the large puddle in the road in front of the new bus shelter, Andy agreed to have this looked at.

The PC agreed to go ahead with the refurbishment of the telephone box at Blackborough End, once this is done the PC will decide what it should be used for.

The PC also discussed having a community clean up of the play field, notification of this will be in the next Parish News.

Much of the meeting was taken up by discussing the precept, especially as the Council has no concrete plans at present for using the money. However, future probabilities include assisting with funding for the playground and the repair of the church wall.

A councillor brought up the possibility that a playing field for young people might be needed. While more investigation is needed as to how much it would be used and where it would be, that is another possible future expense. Besides, spending this year was equal to income. Therefore, the council voted to maintain the precept as it is.

David Wright has made an enquiry about commoners' rights. These are historical, varying from household to household (e.g. some households might have the right to graze a goat, while others might be able to graze 2 cows), but all have the right to collect kindling. The rights attach to properties, not their owners, and are still current for old properties. David has the addresses.








Stewart, 72, is running the London Marathon (again)

My name is Stewart South, from Blackborough End, and I ran my first marathon, all 26.2 miles of it, in London in 2002 when I was just a lad of 54 years of age. And the reason I ran it was



to raise money for research into kidney disease. I had already donated a kidney to our son Joel in 1999 and our other son Oliver had a kidney transplant in 2002, just a few weeks after I ran that first marathon.

Now, at the sprightly age of 72, I am running the London Marathon again, on 26th April for Kidney Research UK. We have been lucky over the years with the health of our two lads, both now in their 40s. But we are always anxious about their health and welfare and, indeed, the other 3 million people in the UK suffering with kidney disease.

There is still no cure for kidney disease and in the last year 5000 people were on the kidney transplant waiting list. Many people wait years for a kidney transplant and last year 260 people on the transplant list died waiting.

There is some encouraging news. Kidney Research UK is funding research into regenerative medicine which basically means that kidney patients could, hopefully, have their own cells used to repair their own damaged kidneys. I am hoping to raise as much money as possible in Marathon sponsorship to help Kidney Research UK continue with this exciting project. What a huge benefit it would be if patients could have their own diseased kidneys repaired, thus avoiding dialysis and waiting anxiously for a transplant.

Incidentally, have you ever wondered how far a 26.2 mile marathon really is? If you travelled from Blackborough End to Swaffham and then on to Dereham, you would still have 3 more miles to go! Yes, the London Marathon is a long way for an old un, but it will be worth it if I

can raise money to help change people's lives for the better. Your generosity will be so much appreciated. Please support me.

NHS IN A NEW DECADE

The start of a new decade is a good time to take stock of where you are, what you have achieved and where you are going.

This year we are entering the third decade of this century; the NHS celebrated its 70th birthday in 2018 so the last 20 years represent only about 30% of its existence. In that time, however, it has experienced the most difficult sustained period of pressure since its inception. We must find the way to manage and meet this demand upon our services.

West Norfolk CCG came into existence during the past decade and will cease to exist as a stand-alone CCG in the next three months when it merges with the other CCGs in the area to form the new Norfolk and Waveney CCG. The idea behind CCGs is that by giving clinicians an influential seat at the commissioning table, the decisions made have a sounder basis medically, which in turn should deliver better outcomes for the patient. At a time where every penny spent has to be examined and justified, the luxury of having small administrative units to manage localities rather than large county areas which confer a saving by doing things at scale, has been difficult to support. There is no doubt money spent on administration will be less with the new merged CCG and it must be right that more of the NHS pound is spent on healthcare rather than administration.

The start of the new decade coincides with a new government. A government which has promised significant investment in the physical infrastructure of the NHS.

Last year our mental health trust was told it would receive £38m to build new wards in Norwich, which will serve people from West Norfolk too, and the Queen Elizabeth Hospital

was given the good news that it will share £70m with the Norfolk and Norwich and James Paget University Hospitals to build a suite of diagnostic centres. The Queen Elizabeth also received an extra £470,000 to help it expand services for local people plus further funding to open 30 more beds.

But we have so much more we wish to do. I make no secret of my desire for more funding for our NHS so we can improve our buildings further, build better IT systems for our hospital and our wider health and care system and improve outcomes for our patients.

I'm proud of my primary care colleagues for doing their bit. GP practices are working together in "Primary Care Networks" to innovate better ways of supporting their patients, and very soon community mental health and nursing/therapy teams will be aligned to work alongside them. More of our local GP practices are offering online consultations as well as phone and face to face contact, and we are starting to introduce a new support service to help patients at some practices in West Norfolk to order repeat prescriptions.

So while the last decade has been difficult there is promise for the future. The changes taking place in the NHS and social care promise benefits from integration of services, for the first time we are encouraging professionals from the different strands of health and social care to work together in a spirit of co-operation on the ground and forming system partnerships across the county as a whole to better plan how investment is made and services provided. I think the quality of the management team we have established in the last few months bodes well for the future running of services in West Norfolk and the new primary care networks and the local delivery group are thriving since their creation.

You can play your part in helping local services to be the best that they can be. You have a responsibility to use the services wisely. The range of services available to you is wide with advice via the telephone and online services through local pharmacies, GP services, ambulance services and A&E services. Use the most appropriate for the type of problem you have to ensure we all get prompt attention from the right professional at the right time.
