### **Felling in Bilney Woods**

The Forestry Commission has notified the Parish Council that they will start felling in February - probably about 20th.

Two areas are to be felled: A block on both sides of the Denton's Farm track just before you reach the houses, and a strip along the southern edge of the forest following the lower path. It looks as if, during the 6 weeks when felling will take place, that all the forest west of the newly shingled fire route will be off bounds. The right of way to Denton's Farm will remain open.

I am told that the Denton's Farm patch is likely to be dealt with first, though that may change as soil conditions vary.

Our local MP James Wild has agreed to attend a meeting to discuss the junction of Station Road and the A47. For obvious reasons this cannot take place whilst Covid19 restrictions are in place.

The Parish Council (PC) website is being developed. This website will be dedicated to Parish Council information. The Chairman's report will also be available in the Parish News.

The telephone box in Blackborough End is awaiting an estimate to repair the door hinge. After the hinge is repaired, the PC has decided it will be used a CD/DVD and book exchange.

There are two vacancies for Parish Councillors, anyone interested is requested to contact the Parish Clerk on 07747 828683.

The Parish Clerk has contacted the Woodland Trust and it has been agreed that the Trust will supply saplings for planting in the playing field.

Again, there is a mole problem at the playing field, it was agreed to contact the mole contractor to reduce the incidence of mole damage.

Over the past year the PC has had problems with Barclays Bank which is unresolved the PC has therefore agreed to transfer accounts to another bank

# **East Winch Parish Council Meeting 14th December 2020**

Having been unable to meet for months, the Council at last met at Middleton Village Hall, East Winch hall being closed. Unfortunately, due to lockdown, we will not be able to meet again for the foreseeable future, and discussion has been by email. Anyone with matters to consider should contact the clerk, Bob Pannell, whose contact details are on the last page of this magazine.

At the meeting, the Council welcomed two new councillors, Mr Andy Bellehouse and Mr Sam Adkin. We are delighted to have increased our numbers, and there is still room for two more.

During the meeting, we discussed various ways in which funds could be used for the benefit of the village. This conversation is ongoing, but soon we will need to establish how much we are likely to be spending, as that will affect the precept; the sum raised annually from Council Tax to fund the Parish Council. Possibilities included making a trod along Common road through the common; providing dog poo bins at the entrance to Bilney woods (though this will require the consent of the forestry Commission) and further down the bridle path to Blackborough End, though both these need the agreement of the Borough Council; getting another flashing speed sign, though putting one up on the A47 is the responsibility of Highways England, so we can't do that; and assisting the Friends - probably to a small degree - to get new playground equipment.

## "Moving on"

Life moves on despite lock-down. The hours of daylight are longer now, snowdrops and aconites are in flower, older people have received vaccines, houses are extended or put up for sale. All of these are signs of 'moving on'.

The church year is moving on too. In January, during Christmas and Epiphany, we were celebrating Christ coming as the Light of the World for all people. The 2nd February, the Feast of the Presentation or Candlemas is the day in the church year for taking 'one last look back to Christmas and turning towards the cross'. By the time you read this, Pancake Day and Ash Wednesday may be over and Lent will have already started. Ash Wednesday this year is the 17th February and Easter will be early in April. Time moves on!

Jesus had been born in Bethlehem and was a refugee in Egypt as a baby, although he grew up and lived in the north at Nazareth in Galilee. After his baptism in the Jordan and his time of temptation in the Judaean wilderness, he returned to Galilee but he didn't go back to living in Nazareth. He knew the time had come for him to 'move on', to start to proclaim his message – "Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven has come near". (See Matthew 4, verses12-23)

Peter and his brother Andrew, and James and his brother John, had always lived down near the lake. They were fishermen and no doubt thought they always would be. Then Jesus invited them to come and follow him. They were being called to 'let go' and 'move on'. The qualities of perseverance, patience and courage that they had needed on the lake would continue to be of value when they 'moved on' to their new task of sharing with Jesus in bringing good news to people. God can always use people's past experience in his service but he uses it in new ways.

'Moving on' doesn't always mean a change of location. After the death of a loved one or the breakdown of a relationship, there comes a time when the bereaved person has worked through the shock, anger and disbelief often associated with loss and is able to 'move on', to set about building a new life for him or herself. All this takes time. How long it takes will vary and can't

be hurried, but being able to 'let go' is often an important part of that 'moving on'.

Whether we are young, old or in-between, we are all called to 'move on'. It is very easy to get stuck in a rut and 'moving on' can feel risky, so we put off doing anything. I'm a great procrastinator! Sometimes we allow our hopes and expectations to die or don't think we can make a difference. Maybe we no longer believe that things can change for the better. Perhaps we fail to recognise or even expect to see God at work in the world.

Has our understanding of God changed during the past year, a year like no other? Do we see our relationship with God moving on? Is our prayer-life growing and developing? Are these questions we ever ask ourselves?

If any of our answers are in the negative, is there something we could do to help ourselves 'move on', if that is what we want to do? We are all different, so how we might move on is bound to vary. It may involve talking with a friend we trust or putting aside a short time each day for silence or prayer.

There are many ways in which we can 'move on' whatever our age. A lot of people in their nineties are young at heart. If we are only 'growing older', we are in trouble. We need to not just be 'growing older' but to be 'colder and growing', taking risks, trying new things and making new discoveries.

Jesus calls each one of us to 'move on', to repent and change. That can mean like the hiker pausing, looking at the map to check where we are and realigning our compass before setting forth. Peter, Andrew, James and John were not sure exactly where they would be going with their new friend, but they were prepared to let go of their old way of life and to 'move on' when Jesus called.

Many people are still sitting in darkness, but *the True Light is already shining* and Jesus invites each one of us to move forward in HIs Light into his kingdom.

How, I wonder, will you and I move on in 2021?






