The PC agreed to pay the usual yearly contribution to the upkeep of the Village Hall car park.





North Runcton News

West Winch Growth Area (WWGA)

The consultation period on road plans for the WWGA ended last week. Thank you to all residents that attended the consultation events and those of you who submitted comments.

NRPC submitted a letter stating: NRPC, and all the residents that Councillors have spoken to, remain extremely concerned that the extent and style of development proposed for the West Winch Growth area will generate large amounts of new local traffic and cause even more congestion on new and existing roads from the inception of the scheme through to long-term operation.

We remain sceptical that traffic conditions on the existing section of the A10 can be substantially improved. Even if all through-traffic is directed onto the new road, local traffic will still increase greatly and local HGV traffic access will still be required.

Meanwhile, even the figures in this consultation suggest sections of the new road are expected to have nearly 30,000 vehicles a day when the scheme is complete, introduced to an area that is presently open countryside. The change will be significant and detrimental.

Residents are not the only people raising concerns. On 11th January the Local Plan examiners adjourned the current hearing until such time as BCKLWN officers can provide evidence to justify the current spatial strategy and housing distribution.

At the time of writing we have not seen the particular questions the examiners want answering, but in the hearings held before Christmas the examiners made it clear they were concerned about the apparent lack of a coherent transport strategy. Meeting national (and local) government goals to create a low carbon, 'multi-modal' transport system must be a key goal of planning documents.

Other News

Thanks to all who attended the quiz at the VMP on 13th January – where we raised over £200 for VMP funds. This will go towards the planned redecoration which will hopefully take place in the Easter holidays. (Thanks to John and Jane

for the quiz and Laura, Anna and Rachel for the catering).

Everyone seems to enjoy these events and it was asked if we can have more. NRPC are currently considering an event to mark the coronation in May – so if anyone has ideas for that we would welcome input.

Wednesday 22nd February at 7.30pm "Northern Tanzania- some Bird and Mammal Highlights" Presented by John Geeson

John joined "Birding Africa's Northern Tanzania tour "in the spring of 2022. The route took him through the major game parks of Northern Tanzania including the famous Ngorogoro and Serengeti reserves, and was timed to coincide with the very impressive mass migration of Wildebeest and Zebra. However these areas are also home to a wealth of other mammals including all of Africa's "Big Five" plus many birds. In two weeks, over 430 species of birds and over 40 species of mammals were seen. Because of the presence of large felines, most of the journeys were spent in an open top Safari vehicle. Thus some of the encounters were at very close range and photographic opportunities were wonderful.

Wednesday 29th March at 7.30pm "The Ecology of Weeting Heath and its Conservation Management" Presented by James Symonds

James is the warden at NWT Weeting Heath and is very enthusiastic about the range of invertebrates, the flora, grassland fungi and other taxonomic groups to be found there. He will explain about the management techniques used to create the ideal conditions for these species, such as the grazing approach and ground disturbance. Come and learn more on the night.

East Winch Parish Council Meeting 10 January 2023

Under Matters Arising, there was nothing further A risk assessment had been undertaken, and to report on the issue of toxic smells, or on the safety works being undertaken to the A47 King's would be reported again. Lynn to Pentney.

Planning applications relating to a proposed eastern extension to Pentney Quarry are to be submitted by Middleton Aggregates. The Parish Council received a presentation on Middleton Aggregates' Community Liaison Statement, describing the proposals prior to submission of the formal planning applications.

The proposal is to extract some 550,000 tonnes of sand and gravel from some 11 hectares of land to the east of the existing Pentney Quarry, between the River Nar and West Bilney Wood. The proposed extraction will take place between 2028-2036 and, to support this, additional planning applications will seek to extend the timescales of the existing quarry and plant site accordingly.

According to the Community Liaison Statement, considerable care has been taken in designing a suitable restoration scheme, and significant landscape and ecological improvement works to a 1.7km stretch of the River Nar will be undertaken with advice from the Norfolk Rivers Trust. The Parish Council heard that the applicant would commit to a 15-year Management Plan for the area after restoration. Parish Council was told there were no current plans for the land after that point, neither were there plans currently for a further, subsequent eastern extension.

Parish Council received reports from County Councillor, Cllr Jim Moriarty and from Borough Councillor, Cllr Michael De Whalley.

The Parish Council considered planning applications relating to Three Ways, Gayton Road, East Winch and to Cherry Tree Farm, Winch Road Gayton. There was nothing further to report on the following planning matters:

Min 40 Silica Sand extraction

- Wellness Resort Project it is unlikely this will now come before the Planning Committee until the Spring or later
- Change of use of woodlands to a holiday and recreation site at Pentney Woods

faulty streetlights and un-replenished saltbins

The Parish Council agreed to maintain the precept for 2023/24 at the same level as in 2022/23. (The precept is the amount of Council Tax that a Parish Council needs to fund the services it provides, e.g. street lighting).

Ms Suzanne Crocker was appointed to the Parish Council to fill one of the two current vacancies in membership. Parish Council elections are to take place on 4 May 2023.

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held in East Winch Village Hall on Tuesday 7 March, beginning at 7.30pm.

Provision of dog bins: The crappy facts.

Further to requests from residents, especially in relation to dog mess left on Hardwick Common, North Runcton Parish Council have erected a new dog bin adjacent to the common footpath. The bin was donated by the Plymouth Brethren Christian Church and erected by Cllr Barry Houchen (thanks to both).

This now means that North Runcton Parish Council have provided 5 dog bins in the parish. There are approximately 250 households within North Runcton parish, which means



that (as national averages suggest around 30% of UK households keep a dog) there is now one dog bin for every 15 dog owners.

This seems like a high ratio – but NRPC is not unusual. Records suggest that West Winch PC have provided 11, Middleton 10 and East Winch 7. The large villages of Heacham and Dersingham each have over 30. Across the Borough there are now well over 800 dog bins.

As we have found in North Runcton, many people now seem to think that provision of dog bins is 'convention'. But Local Authorities are not required to provide them and legislation actually puts the onus on the owner to cleanup. Under the 1996 Dog (Fouling of Land) Act it became an offence not to clean up, with a maximum fine of £1000. The Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005 enabled local authorities to introduce and enforce their own dog fouling bye-laws.

Provision of bins (which, it has to be stated, is generally in response to those dog owners that continue to flout the law) therefore seems to have become 'normalised' only since the 1990s, but it is creating a large and growing demand on the public purse.

It is not so much the cost of the bins (around £300 each). As noted, our new bin was donated and parish councillors have 'subsidised' the erection of all of our bins with

voluntary time. Nevertheless, if there are over 800 bins in the Borough – that is probably £250.000 worth!

But the bins are then emptied every week – which is undertaken by the Borough who charge £100 per bin per year. The County Council then pick up the tab to dispose of the waste – which is of course, full of plastic bags and other rubbish that people deposit. It is therefore trucked to Bedfordshire where it is incinerated.

A full 45 litre bin of dog waste might weigh 50kg? It therefore seems possible that 'dog waste', sent for incineration from West Norfolk alone, now amounts to between 1000 and 2000 tonnes every year (at a current cost of over £103/tonne). This does not seem like environmentally sound policy.

A recent FOI request did not manage to establish whether this service is included in the Borough's newly introduced annual carbon audit – but remember BCKLWN have pledged to be 'carbon neutral' by 2035 – or earlier. This may be a difficult (and growing) problem to 'neutralise'.

One way or another we are all paying to manage this growing waste stream – either directly through taxes or indirectly through cuts to other services. Our hospital is falling down, the NHS is at breaking point, the County Council is trying to save £60 million from this year's budget alone and the Borough Council have been cutting staff and services for several years. We don't need additional cost burdens!

I would think many people would agree with me that this is a 'public' problem that must not be allowed to grow. If you chose to own a dog you need to take responsibility for all that that involves. It would be entirely possible to pick up waste in a paper bag and take home to your own composting bin. This would be reasonable and environmentally responsible.

A range of manufacturers sell composting bins for less than £100 – but any suitable container would do. The American 'Enviro Pet Waste Network' already give advice about sustainable waste management https://epwn.org and there may now be similar UK organisations. If not – there is a gap in the market for you entrepreneurs!

HELP IS AT HAND IF YOU ASK





Christmas and New Year is a time for celebration but for people struggling with everyday living costs it can feel like an extra demand on a budget that already doesn't go far enough.

The stress this causes for many people is overwhelming and they tend to live life from day-to-day or even moment-to-moment and this has the effect of storing up bigger problems for later.

People often respond to money problems in one of two ways. They either avoid the problem altogether because they don't know how to get out of it or panic and go for a short-term solution like giving up their home or going to a moneylender – both of which usually make things worse in the long term.

But it doesn't have to be like that and the council's main message is: talk to us before doing anything else – we can help.

We can check that you are getting all the financial benefits you are entitled to. If you're in debt we have services that will help you get back on track. If you find yourself in crisis we may be able to arrange help with food and rent costs.

If you're struggling with your mental health we can put you in touch with people who can help with that too.

We understand that it can be really difficult to think beyond today's problems but if you can just take that first step of talking to us, it could be the most important conversation you have this year.

Money advice not money lenders

Because going to a money lender means fast access to cash without having to fill out forms, it can be a really tempting choice. But these people prey on desperation, charging huge amounts of interest and sometimes threatening or using violence to make you pay.

There ARE alternatives. If you get proper money advice they can help you maximise your income, making sure you are getting all the benefits you are entitled to and other help, such as discretionary support payments. They may be able to help you consolidate some of your debt or help you make payment agreements that you can manage.

The council pays for a money advice service that's specially to help with this and free to use – visit moneyadvicehub.org.uk or call 01553 970004.

Hang on to your home?

Rent is usually a household's biggest cost and recently we have had a lot of phone calls from people who have given up their tenancies because they think they can't afford it. They intend to go on the housing register to get an affordable home.

What many people don't realise is that in many cases Government rules see this as making yourself 'intentionally homeless', which means that the council can't do much to help.

Even if we can help, it could be a long wait as very few affordable homes are available and there are around 1,400 people on the housing register in this borough alone. Over the past three months only 19 homes with 3 or more bedrooms have become available – that's about 6 each month.

For most people the best plan is to work out a way of staying in your current home. We can help with this.

Even if staying where you are isn't right for you, the most important thing you can do is talk to us before making any big decisions as this is when we can give you the most help.

DO YOU SUFFER FROM LONG COVID?
