NORTH RUNCTON HAS A DEFIBRILLATOR

North Runcton residents will now be better equipped to cope with heart attacks thanks to a generous donation from the Rapid Relief Team (RRT), a charitable organisation run by the Plymouth Brethren Christian Church.

The new emergency equipment has been installed at North Runcton Cricket Club and will be maintained by the Parish Council. The cricket club pavilion was considered a good central location to have the defibrillator as it should be easily found in an emergency. Thanks are extended to the Towler family for allowing us to locate it here.

Defibrillators are used to administer an electric shock to patients suffering cardiac arrest. If you think someone has had a cardiac arrest – ring 999 and emergency services will direct you to the nearest machine and give you a code to open the lockable box.

Anyone can use one. Pressing a button on the machine initiates verbal instructions that tell the first aider what to do. Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

In April the Annual Parish Meeting was held, despite advertising the fact in the Parish magazine only six parishioners turned up. This was very disappointing as well as embarrassing as Police Constable Lee Anderson had come along specifically to talk about the latest police initiative for our area.

Reports were given by Peter Gidney our area Councillor, myself, Parish Magazine, Badminton Club, Mothers Union, Bowls Club and the Community Car Scheme organiser. There was no report from our County Councillor Graham Middleton, although he had been invited to attend the meeting.

The Annual Parish Meeting was followed by the Parish Council Meeting. Having received quotations for the verge cutting it was noted that the grant we would receive from Norfolk County Council (NCC) would not be sufficient to cover the quotations. It was decided not to pursue this matter.

It was agreed to apply to NCC for a grant under the Parish Partnership for the bus shelter in Station Road. The grant will be for 50% of the cost. The remainder will be supplied by the Parish Council (PC). There was an instance of graffiti in the playing field which was eventually cleaned up. The PC are considering using a substance that makes it difficult to write on any surface treated.

As usual there were various problems associated with highway issues, these will be reported to the local Highway Authority. There were no objections to Planning application 19/00505/F.

The PC discussed the provision of a defibrillator for the Parish as there was some reservations when this matter was previously discussed. The PC are arranging for a demonstration of the equipment.

There is a vacant allotment, anyone wishing to rent the plot could they please contact the Parish Clerk Mrs Elaine Oliver on 01553 630655. The PC have been informed that the Church Commissioners are to dispose of the land which includes the allotments. The allotments will not be affected by any sale as they are protected.

NORTH RUNCTON CONSERVATION VOLUNTEERS

With the growing concern around the damaging impact we are having on the natural environment, it is easy to feel that there is nothing we, as individuals, can do to help. With this in mind, North Runcton Parish Council has set up "North Runcton Conservation Volunteers", a group that is beginning to organise activities around protecting and sustaining the common land in North Runcton parish. Some of these planned activities, such as the dawn chorus walk and the bat detecting evening, are aimed at giving residents of all ages the opportunity to find out about the range of wildlife and flora that is already living in our commons. We will also be training volunteers to be able to lead working groups that can then undertake work to further enrich the range of habitats. For example, there are two silted up ponds in Sheep's Course Wood and the group plan to dig these out and re-establish an aquatic habitat in the wood.

Although North Runcton Conservation Volunteers is at a very early stage of launching itself, we are very keen to ensure that all those living in North Runcton, young and old, will be able to contribute to and benefit from future opportunities to enhance the commons we are so lucky to have in our parish. Thy Kingdom Come

Yes, it's such a well-known phrase that, unless you're really concentrating, it's almost meaningless.

But it might be the most important part of the Lord's Prayer!

During his time on earth Jesus said his kingdom was here, but that made the importance of convincing people he was their saviour all the greater. The gospels tell us that after rising from the dead on Easter Day, Jesus appeared to his followers, and instructed them to take the good news of his saving power to all nations. According to St Luke, he was then taken up to heaven as his followers watched. Christians celebrate this as Ascension Day, this year, on 30th May. A few days later, St Luke tells us that the Holy Spirit came to the gathered disciples as a strong rushing wind and tongues of flame. Suddenly, the disciples were empowered with confidence, fearlessness, and the ability to communicate with anyone and everyone. This amazing and thrilling event will be celebrated as Pentecost or Whitsun on 9th June.

A few years ago the Anglican archbishops decided to act on the prayer 'Thy Kingdom come", concentrating on the time between Ascension Day and Whitsun. Many other denominations have taken up the idea. The message is this: Jesus still lives in our hearts and influences what we do. His presence is a source of love, joy and healing. We want other people to experience the release from guilt, fear and despair by believing what he taught and that he is the son of God and our Saviour. 'The Lord is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation,' as psalm 118 exclaims.

What might Christians do to bring more people into God's kingdom? Someone suggested praying for about 5 people, and trusting that at least one of them will turn to Jesus. We could invite people to come to church with us. We could be ready to talk about our faith.

This is not about getting bums on seats, though more of these would be welcome indeed! It's about more people experiencing the joy and salvation and forgiveness that becoming a Christian brings.

The kingdom of Jesus is a kingdom of freedom, trust, love and tranquil minds. It's worth praying for.

East Winch Parish Council Annual Parish Meeting and Parish Council Meeting 9th May

The meeting was attended by one of our new Borough Councillors, Mr. De Whalley.

In the Annual Parish Meeting the Chairman's and other reports were read, and the accounts for the last financial year approved.

At the following meeting, Nell Steele and Keith Harrod were reappointed as Chairman and Deputy.

Mr. De Whalley (Green Party) explained that he and Colin Manning (Conservative) would be sharing responsibility for the Grimston/Gayton ward, which now includes East Winch. They hadn't yet sorted out individual responsibilities, but that would need to be done. He will do his best to help with planning issues and other matters. King's Lynn Council is now made up of 28 Conservatives, 17 Independents, led by Jim Moriarty, 1 Green (Mr de Whalley), 1 Lib Dem, and 10 Labour councillors.

Parishioners complained of speeding and very noisy vehicles on the Walton Rd. The problem is to be considered at greater length at the next meeting, but meanwhile the couple are willing to join the Speedwatch volunteers.

Highway matters. The council has finally heard from NCC Highways that the potholes and ruined trod in Station Rd will be followed up.

Concrete has been dumped near the telephone box. The new street light near the junction with Ashwicken Rd appears to have been bumped into, as it's leaning - before ever it started working!

Several of the street lights along the A47 in Bilney are out of action. The council is attempting to work out exactly which ones before informing Highways England.

The next meeting takes place on Monday, 1st July, at 7.30.
