# FIRST WORLD WAR CENTENARY

This edition of the Parish News has a strong World War 1 theme. Over the last four years, the whole country has been marking the centenary of the First World War. Regular readers will hopefully have noticed that throughout that period we have published a series of "We Will Remember Them" articles in tribute to the men from our villages who lost their lives in the war. Each tribute has been published as closely as possible to the centenary of their deaths. The last two tributes appear on page 5 of this edition

For some of the men, the information about them was taken from the Roll of Honour for the North Runcton War Memorial re-dedication service on 9 August 2014 or from the East Winch & West Bilney Community Project website.

For the men named on the Middleton War Memorial (two of whom are also named on the North Runcton War Memorial), we have been fortunate and proud to publish a series of articles by Chris Dixon which have provided a fascinating insight into the background of 27 men, their families and the tragic circumstances of their ultimate sacrifice. In addition, Chris has contributed articles on wider aspects of the war at home and abroad.

Each of the tributes is the product of a huge amount of research by Chris, not just into the men themselves but also into the conduct of the war. I would like to take this opportunity to express my profound thanks, and those of all readers, to Chris for his unique contribution to Middleton's commemoration of the centenary of the First World War.

We are now about to commemorate the centenary of the end of the war. Further information on the plans being made in Middleton, North Runcton and East Winch can be found on pages 4 & 5.

In addition to these formal events, the Middleton and District Branch of the Royal British Legion is holding an evening of poetry and drama on Thursday, 18 October - full details on page 11. One of the driving forces within the Branch is local resident, Lilian Fisher and you can read about her skydiving exploits in support of the RBL on page 13.

Although the centenary commemorations are coming to an end, our responsibility to remember the sacrifices made is one which will endure forever.

## NORTH RUNCTON ART GROUP KNOWS THE SECRET

As the years roll by, older people are often asked respectfully - 'What is your secret to a long life? The answers are often predictable: 'A glass of stout every night' or 'I go for a walk every day'. At North Runcton Art Group we have the real answer - 'Painting with friends every week.' The proof of this statement is that of our 30 or so members, a third are in their eighties and one will reach 90 in November.

Artist, Ted Bailey from West Winch, was born in Manor Park, Outer London in 1928. As a boy, he clearly remembers standing at the end of the garden watching Spitfires take off from Hornchurch Aerodrome. The runway, extended on account of the war, stretched to the end of the family's garden and from time to time, Ted has recalled these childhood memories by painting a picture of a Spitfire.




By 1943, aged 14, Ted was an apprentice carpenter, later working at Fords and then the Post Office in Corby. He transferred to King's Lynn with the Post office in 1969 where he worked until retirement in 1988.

Ted has always loved painting and spent years ' dabbling at home'. He is a committed member of North Runcton Art Group and a regular contributor to the art group calendar. His work, which has a charming naïve style, can be seen at the annual exhibition in November. To honour this occasion, we shall devote a special section to Ted's work and a spitfire or two may number among his paintings on display. It is possible that a nightly tot of whisky may have assisted Ted in attaining his 90 years!

## MIDDLETON MARKS CENTENARY OF FIRST WORLD WAR ARMISTICE



The First World War ended one hundred years ago on 11 November 1918. Peace at last after a long and brutal conflict. Estimates vary, but the war resulted in about 20 million deaths and 21 million wounded. Of those killed, roughly half were military personnel and half were civilians.

In the United Kingdom, about 6 million men were mobilised, of whom just over 700,000 were to lose their lives. Middleton is commemorating the end of the war, and paying tribute to the men from this Parish who were killed, with an exhibition and other events over the weekend of **10 and 11 November**. Everyone is invited to come along and share in the commemorations.

#### **EXHIBITION AND EVENTS**

• In the lead up to the commemorations, a number of large metal poppies will be placed at key points around the village.

 An exhibition of World War 1 artefacts, as well as photos of some of the local men who were killed and photos of the Middleton they knew, will be open in St Mary's Church from 10.00am to 4pm on 10 and 11 November.

Refreshments will be available. If you have any World War 1 family memorabilia or other items that you would be happy to see displayed at the exhibition, please get in touch as soon as possible.

- There will be an unveiling of a hand crafted tribute to the men of the parish who lost their lives in the war.
- The **Remembrance Day Service** will take place at Middleton Church at **10:45am on Sunday, 11 November**. The church will be specially decorated for the occasion. After the service there will be a brief planting ceremony for a memorial tree in the grounds of the church, together with a commemorative plaque. [Please note that there will be a rehearsal for the Remembrance Day Service at 2pm on 10th November at Middleton Church.]
- The commemoration weekend will end with the lighting of the beacon at the Village Hall at 6.55pm, then the ringing of the church bell as part of a nationwide event.

## WE WILL REMEMBER THEM

#### **Matthew Shawll**

Born in Middleton in 1887, Matthew was raised by his mother in her parents' house in Sandy Lane, Blackborough End. He became an agricultural labourer after leaving school and married Jane Griggs, from North Runcton, in Middleton church in the autumn of 1910. They moved into Field Cottages, Wormegay Road where Matthew found employment as a carriage builder's assistant.

It is not known when he joined the army, but towards the end of the war he was in France as a 32 year old private in the 1st Battalion, Cambridgeshire Regiment.

The German army was in full retreat and on the night of 13th/14th October, 1918, the Cambridgeshires made an attack to the north of the village of Auby, just north of Douai. They captured 45 prisoners and eight machine guns before a counter attack forced them to retreat to their starting position. During the night Matthew was killed in the enemy positions.

His body was found after the war and re-buried in Point-du-Jour Military Cemetery, Athies, east of Arras, on 24th February 1920.



#### **Robert Bowman**

Private 5428. 2nd Battalion Leinster Regiment. Formerly 124146 Royal Field Artillery. Died of wounds in France and Flanders on 24th October 1918. Aged 24. Born in Hardwick, Norfolk. Lived and enlisted in King's Lynn. Son of Sarah Bowman of Hardwick, King's Lynn.

## Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

There was much discussion regarding the land at the bottom of Water Lane.

It transpired that in 1976 the land was registered as common land by the Borough Council King's Lynn, this was to ensure the land was protected as common land which must remain open to the public. The land is still owned by the Parish Council(PC) and therefore an application will be made to have the land re-registered to the Parish.

An interesting historical fact came out from the discussions in that originally the land was a depression that filled with water and was used by livestock. It was always known as Pit Land and it was agreed that this will now be used in the future when the land is referred to.

The redundant telephone box in Blackborough End is owned by the Community Heartbeat scheme for the purpose of installing a defibrillator. The scheme would not provide the defibrillator but would assist the Parish Council in raising money to purchase and install the defibrillator.

Some time ago the PC understood that we could take back ownership of the telephone box if nothing was done by the Community Heartbeat scheme but this is not so. The PC can only regain ownership of the telephone box if they install a defibrillator nearby or in the telephone box.

Due to the many objections from the residents of Hill Road, the PC have decided not to proceed with a brick bus shelter but will refurbish the existing one. As previously agreed the bus shelter in Station Road will be replaced with a brick built one.

The PC agreed to adopt the village sign in Blackborough End.

Again there were several issues raised regarding the Highways, pot holes being the main problem; some have been ongoing. All the PC can do is keep raising the issues with the Highways Department.

## SACRAMENT & CONFIRMATION

As we are ahead of Confirmation this year in October so wonder if we may reflect on Sacraments.

The sacrament is defined as an outward sign of an invisible spiritual reality. This outward sign functions as a channel through which God imparts sanctifying grace into the soul.


**Confirmation** is defined as the seal or completion of baptism; the reception of the mark of <u>God the Holy Spirit</u>.

Together with Baptism the <u>Confirmation</u> is one of the sacraments of initiation into the Church. This special anointing given by the Bishop (by placing his hands on candidate) has the effect of increasing, deepening, and strengthening the sanctifying grace of God given to us at our baptism; while baptism removes from our souls the stain of original sin. Confirmation pours into our souls the power of the Holy Spirit and his gifts – and is the most closely identified with the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Both Sacraments (Baptism and Confirmation) roots us more deeply in the divine affiliation (being adopted as sons and daughters of God), and unites us more firmly to Jesus Christ. Increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us, and renders our bond with the Church more perfect and gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ.

Thus Sacraments are outward signs of inward grace, instituted by Christ for our sanctification.

For those soon to be Confirmed, may prepare for receiving of such a marvellous gift of the Holy Spirit, and for those who have already been Confirmed can inspire the following question in our hearts: Am I fully living according to the grace of the Holy Spirit bestowed on me at my Confirmation?

## NEWS FROM NORTH RUNCTON PARISH COUNCIL

#### 'Wildlife in Common'

Norfolk Wildlife Trust have embarked on a new 2 year Heritage Lottery Funded project to survey the natural and historic wealth of the county's common lands. The project will aim to train community volunteers to help survey the wildlife and history of local commons; celebrate and increase awareness of common land heritage; and identify practical measures to conserve and enhance these important open spaces. North Runcton has several areas of common land – all of which may date back to Anglo-Saxon times. We will be supporting the NWT project and would invite anybody interested in surveying the commons or researching their history to get in touch. #### **Bulb Planting**

We intend to undertake more bulb planting this year – continuing along the verges of Rectory Lane. The planting day has been set as **Saturday 20th October**. Meet at 10AM at Rectory Lane. Refreshments will be provided.

#### West Winch Growth Area

Since the Neighbourhood Plan was approved and adopted you may be thinking plans for development have gone quiet. However, we understand an 'Infrastructure Delivery Plan' will shortly be presented to the Borough cabinet (October). When this is endorsed it is likely that determination of the Hopkins Homes outline application for 1100 homes (Ref 13/01615/OM, first submitted back in 2013) will move forward quickly. We also understand that detailed design of the first section of a relief road is now quite advanced. Preliminary findings of the Kings Lynn Transport Strategy study (which will supposedly address transport planning for the whole town in coming years) are also due to be made public in coming weeks. All these proposals will have a great bearing on the A47, the A10 and our communities!

Lilian Fisher is a remarkable lady. At 79 years young, she has just completed her second fund-raising skydive in support of the Royal British Legion. It takes courage and determination to jump 13,000 feet from a plane, but equally impressive is that Lilian, who lives in North Runcton, will soon have served 10 years as Poppy Appeal organiser for the Middleton & District Branch.

Lilian explained that her first skydive was five years ago, but she was keen to repeat the experience this year to mark the centenary of the end of the First World War. Having undergone eye surgery earlier this year, she had to time the jump to ensure she was sufficiently recovered, but before a second eye operation in September. Fortunately, there was a slot at Langar Airfield in Nottingham on 7 August.

Asked if she was apprehensive, she replied: "What could go wrong strapped to a handsome and experienced Red Devil? It was a wonderful experience. For the first part of the dive we were falling at about 120 mph and at one point I found myself looking up towards the sky. Once the parachute opens there is a much more gentle and controlled descent to the ground."

Lilian's jump raised about £1,200 for the Royal British Legion, but she has helped to raise much more via her service as local organiser of the annual Poppy Appeal. The busy period starts in September when she orders and takes receipt of all the poppies, badges, wristbands and other items on offer. In October, about 300 collection boxes are distributed to local venues and have to be collected after the appeal. Lilian ensures that each venue receives a Thank You card telling them the amount collected.

She prepares a rota for the 40 helpers who run the collection points at local supermarkets in the two weeks leading up to Remembrance Day, dealing with any problems, resupplying poppies etc and keeping track of the money collected each day. She hosts a Thank You tea in March each year for all the poppy appeal helpers, as well as organising regular fundraising buffets and lunches for the Royal British Legion throughout the year.

It all takes a lot of work, but last year's poppy appeal raised £25,000. Lilian emphasised that the poppy appeal was a team effort and she wanted to give a Big Thank You to everyone who has given their time and support. In addition to her two parachute jumps, Lilian also climbed the roof of the O2 Arena to celebrate her 76th birthday. She says she has no current plans for another skydive or other adrenalin pumping event – but never say never again!


