Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

The Parish Council (PC) has agreed to proceed with a defibrillator, the funding for its purchase is being arranged. The PC has agreed to fund the installation costs and as previously stated, the defibrillator will be installed at the Village Hall.

The PC have been informed that the defibrillator at the Golf Club would also be available to the general public.

The PC agreed to the cost of the Risk Assessment for this year but will be looking at alternative ways of carrying out these assessments.

As in previous years the PC will purchase a wreath for Remembrance Day. Councillor R Smith will attend the ceremony on behalf of the PC.

The PC considered the letter from Highways England which asked if the PC could suggest any improvements to the A47 between Pentney and the Hardwick Roundabout. Apart from duelling the road, the only practical suggestion was to install LED lighting, this would improve the lighting and cast less shadows.

It was agreed the PC would support a garage/yard sale next year if there was sufficient interest. Anyone who would be interested in taking part is asked to contact the Parish Clerk by email to:

The PC discussed setting up a Facebook page for the PC, this would give up-to-date information and give parishioners a chance to have their say. It was agreed to investigate the possibility of going ahead with the Facebook or a similar system.

The PC was formally informed of the resignation of Councillor Trevor Hewitt and thereby creating a vacancy on the PC. Any person interested should contact the Parish Clerk on the email address above.

It was agreed to move the planters from the playing field to other locations within the Parish. The reason being that on previous occasions when the planters had been planted up the plants have been removed. It is hoped that in their new locations the planters will not be vandalized.

Several parishioners have complained to the PC about the amount of straw being deposited on the roads and pavements in the Parish, unfortunately the PC have no powers to enforce the clean up.

CAMEO CAFE CLOSES

After 10 years of bringing local people together, the Cameo Cafe is now closed.

The cafe's name reflected its purpose: "Come And Meet Each Other" and the first session was in May 2009.

It was started by members of the Mothers' Union to provide a meeting point for villagers especially young mums who might feel isolated at home with young children. It was hoped that they might call into the cafe for a drink and a chat before collecting children from school. At first they struggled to meet the cost of hiring the hall but the MU diocesan office gave a start up grant which was repaid in 2017.

In August 2010 we started to share the session with the short mat bowlers and donations from the bowling club paid half of the rent. At this time visitors numbered between 15 and 20 not including the bowlers.

Over the years many of our regular visitors moved to live with family or sheltered accommodation and we all became more frail. Numbers of helpers and visitors dwindled. We are most grateful for all the help we have had most especially from Eileen Howell who has faithfully baked every month for the cafe. Over the last year or so the bowlers have paid all the rent for the hall and without this help the CAMEO cafe would have closed long ago. Thanks to our regular helpers Hilary Hickman, Carol Knights and Beryl Roberts and Jean Wright.



East Winch Parish Council Meeting 2nd September

This meeting was attended by representatives of Friends of East Winch and West Bilney, a group fundraising to buy updated play equipment for the Town Close playground. They wanted to know whether the Council would help with funding. The chairman said that she thought it likely the council would try to help if there was a shortfall, but it depended on other circumstances too, and at present no firm assurances could be given.

The meeting was attended by Borough Councillor Colin Manning, who informed us that the new Chief Executive of the council is Lorraine Gore.

Speedwatch volunteers are awaiting a training date.

The go-ahead was given to purchase and install the case for the defibrillator which is being bought by the RSPCA. The heated box has since been installed on the outside of the Village Hall, and it was agreed that training sessions would be arranged there in the afternoon or evening.

The Parish Clerk had been sent a consultation about paths for cyclists, horse riders and walkers along the A47 from Pentney to the Hardwick roundabout. Comments to be returned to Highways England include the need for a continuous footpath along the A47 in Bilney; that on the north side of the road in East Winch the footpath should be continuous or at least one should run from Burman Mews to Gayton Rd; that the footpath on the south side should be improved and extended the short distance to the Blackborough Road; and that a path was needed from the bridleway which comes out onto the A47 opposite the reservoir into Middleton.

Councillors complained that a right of way was blocked at the old garage in Bilney and that the people working there had shown no inclination to restore it. The clerk informed NCC and a representative from them visited and was assured it would be restored. The removal of the hedge at the entrance to the path seems to be something we have no power to remedy.



Trinity Rotary Club King's Lynn Giving Shelter When Disaster Strikes

Each year, the Trinity Rotary Club of King's Lynn have raised funds for the charity Shelterbox to buy boxes to be sent out to areas devastated by natural disasters.

Earlier this year, volunteers for Trinity carried out a collection at the Asda store at South Wootton. Over two days, the generosity of local people raised nearly £1,000 which, with a small top-up from Trinity funds, was enough to purchase two boxes.

So what are Shelter boxes? ShelterBox delivers the essentials people need to begin rebuilding their lives. Each box is tailored to a disaster but typically contains:

- A relief tent for a family
- Thermal blankets and groundsheets
- Water storage and purification equipment
- Solar lamps
- Cooking utensils
- A basic tool kit
- Children's activity pack.

In one recent example, ShelterBox helped Enoch and Mary who live on a homestead in the village of Kadewere in the Zomba district of Malawi with their four children. Enoch is totally blind and just before Christmas, torrential rains and devastating gales destroyed their house. All of their precious belongings were lost. They were left to sleep in the remains of the house, with no protection from the elements.

Mary had to leave Enoch and the children and brave a long, frightening journey alone to find help from the nearest emergency camp. Many miles and hours later she arrived and came across a ShelterBox team. They took Mary home to her village, helped to put up a tent and gave the family a ShelterBox. From warm blankets and a cooking set to solar lights and a tool kit, it contained everything they needed to

survive. Not just survive, but to start picking up the threads of daily life, to start looking to the future.

Trinity Rotary Club will continue with their annual collections for Shelterbox, but would welcome any contributions for readers of the Parish News.


