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EAST WINCH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 5 SEPTEMBER

The Parish Council had written to Adrian Flux to convey the concerns raised by Parishioners at the previous meeting about the noise levels and lateness of the various parties held on the Adrian Flux site at East Winch Hall on three occasions in June, and also about the fireworks which present a particular problem for residents with horses and other pets. The Parish Council had asked the company to give due regard, going forward, to their neighbours in East Winch and West Bilney when planning any further such events that might impact upon them.

Mr Paul Twite, the General Manager of Adrian Flux, attended the Parish Council meeting on 5 September to listen and to respond to the concerns of parishioners. The Parish Council very much welcomed this responsiveness on the part of the company. However, it was particularly disappointing that no parishioners attended the meeting.

Mr Twite said he fully appreciated the concerns of residents. He explained that 2023 was a special year for the company as it was its 50th birthday. The East Winch Hall site had also this year hosted (by request) a party to mark Kings Lynn's Festival Too. A further Adrian Flux staff family party was to be held on Saturday 9 September from 2pm-10.30pm, with fireworks.

He assured the Parish Council that the relevant **Environmental Protection regulations were** taken into account, and that strict finishing times would be adhered to. He said the company was considering a move towards this earlier, family party model rather than the normal 8pm-12pm timing for staff parties. Mr Twite said he fully understood the particular problem that fireworks posed for residents with horses and other pets and the importance of getting timely communications so that steps can be taken to protect and to calm the animals. He agreed to attend the Parish Council's meeting in May 2024 to confirm the company's arrangements for next year. Mr Twite said he was happy to receive any concerns from parishioners, and Adrian Flux would be pleased to engage with the Parish Council on other issues if that would be of assistance.

Other matters:

 County Councillor Jim Moriarty and Borough Councillors Michael De Whalley

- and Bal Anota were unable to attend the meeting but Mr Anota submitted a written report.
- The Clerk was asked to get clarification from the Trustees about the current position of the future of East Winch Village Hall
- There was no progress to report on either the completion of the pedestrian Trod to the Post Office or about the proposed resiting of a bus-shelter on the A47 opposite the Carpenter's Arms.
- The Parish Council is continuing to look for a village handyman, a role which comes with a small honorarium.
 Volunteers are also needed for the village's Speed Monitoring Team. Anyone interested should contact the Parish Clerk, bob.pannell1@btinternet.com.

There has been an update on Water Lane from Jim Moriarty. It seems the only options that can be implemented within the budget would be road painted signs stating no entry at the point where the road becomes one way and possibly a flashing slow down sign at some point on the lane. Jim is going to get some graphics of what exactly these would be, and where.

The lorries through Hill Road and Station Road were also discussed after a resident who contacted the County Council asking for a weight restriction was told that this wouldn't be approved due to lorries having a right of access and likely objections from residents of Leziate if all the lorries were sent that way.

The PC said at a previous meeting that we would back the proposal of a weight restriction through Middleton and Fairgreen. At this point, as when previously tried for, it seems that we can't get anywhere.

Wednesday 25 October 2023 at 7.30pm "Geology of the Breckland"

Tim Pankhurst is the Regional Conservation Manager at Plantlife International which is at the heart of a worldwide network that is spearheading the race to save wild flowers, plants and fungi. We need wild plants and fungi to survive. Unfortunately, both wild flowers and pollinators are disappearing rapidly.

The Breckland heath and woodland form a unique and richly diverse ecosystem providing habitats for the notable species of birds and fauna which are special to this area of East Anglia. Tim's role in applying threatened plant conservation programmes here in East Anglia is critically dependent on understanding the Breckland Geology which underpins this outstanding landscape and supports the intriguing Breckland Flora. Tim's presentation gives us a perfect opportunity to understand how we might support our environment and what makes Breckland special.

Wednesday 29 November 2023 at 7.30pm "My Life as a Gamekeeper – Friend or Foe?"

Nigel Davies, the much respected gamekeeper, has worked on Stow Estate since 1972. His role has altered and expanded greatly since those early years and now his work includes more of the conservation and protection of nature. He is keen to pass on his extensive knowledge and experience of all things "countryside" and leads many walks including dawn chorus walks and deer watching. From the hundreds of bird boxes on the estate, thousands of birds have been ringed over the years revealing some fascinating facts about wild birds' movements. This will be a presentation with a difference – you will not just be gazing at a screen; there will be real examples to illustrate his talk. Come and share his enthusiasm for his life's work.

Update on the Middleton and Gayton Primary Academies

The summer term has seen the hard work and success in both schools confirmed through positive Ofsted inspection reports.

Gayton was inspected at the start of the summer term and found that it continues to be a good school. It was described as a welcoming and inclusive school where children enjoy learning. The curriculum was praised and the importance placed on reading was recognised.

Meanwhile, Middleton received a monitoring visit in June where the inspector praised the work of the committed staff in bringing about improvements in a relatively short period of time. The school was judged as inadequate in May 2022 but this second monitoring visit highlighted the improvements in the curriculum and the provision for children with special educational needs. The teaching of early reading was recognised as being established with children learning to read with confidence and accuracy. The report states that the school is a calm and safe place for children to learn. The full report is available at https://files.ofsted.gov.uk/v1/file/50223493.

Both schools are part of the Diocese of Norwich Education and Academies Trust and the support from the trust is noted in each report. With staff across both schools working closely together the federation is well placed to improve further next year, during which Middleton can expect a full inspection.

Through the year I have been deployed by the Trust as an Interim Headteacher at Middleton. This has allowed Executive Headteacher, Mrs Greenhalgh, to focus on the move into the wonderful new building at Gayton and leading the school through the successful Ofsted inspection. With both schools on an upward trajectory and the children at Gayton settled in their new classrooms Mrs Greenhalgh will now return to her full executive role and oversee the development of the federation.

I will still support on a weekly basis until Middleton receives its full inspection. This is a reflection of DNEATs commitment to see both schools continue to flourish. I have really enjoyed my time at Middleton and am pleased that I will still be closely involved through the autumn.

Middleton will continue to have three classes with approximately 15 children in each class. We have spaces in all year groups, including nursery. If you are a parent interested in a place

for your child, please get in touch. We would be very happy to meet you and show you around.

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

DANIEL GURNEY (1791 – 1880) PROMINENT RESIDENT OF NORTH RUNCTON

I was first introduced when looking at the history of the King's Lynn General Hospital built off London Road in 1834 for £2,000 by John Sugars. A neat classical building extended in 1848 and 1852 but sadly demolished in the 1980s. Bequests and fund raising by King's Lynn medical men and local gentry ensure4d a successful project campaign.

And it was Daniel Gurney who led the campaign and elected first Trust chairman. Born in Norwich and youngest son of England's leading Quaker family. They were bankers. After a spell in Gurney's bank in Norwich Daniel moved to the Lynn Bank (King's Staith) in 1806.

In 1816 Daniel Gurney purchased a "quaint homestead' at North Runcton where his sister Rachel was housekeeper. Another sister was the famous Elizabeth Fry, the prison reformer. He married Jemima daughter of the Earl of Erroll in 1822 and they had nine children.

As well as an antiquarian (FSA) Daniel Gurney was an outstanding philanthropist beyond his patronage of King's Lynn Hospital. In 1836 when 195 migrants embarked at Friars Fleet in King' Lynn to emigrate to Canada he distributed bibles and prayer books.

He rebuilt Runcton Hall 1833 - 36 with Salvin the architect and the house was extended 1853 - 4. In Kelly's Directory (1845), it is described as "a large white brick mansion which cost £5,000". It had a tower added in 1853 when Daniel Gurney became High Sheriff.

Daniel Gurney died in 1880 and is buried in the churchyard here at North Runcton beside his wife. The memorial in the church to Daniel Gurney is a painting of the figures of the four Evangelists by Lamponi of Florence presented in 1899 by S.A. Gurney KCVO.

Runcton Hall became the seat of Somerville Arthur Gurney who bought a fine oak staircase taken out of St Ann's House in King's Lynn.

By 1922 Runcton Hall was the seat of Walter Sommerville Gurney and described "as a white brick mansion situated in pleasant grounds". He was one of the five chief landowners in the parish. Another Daniel Gurney was living at The Grange.

With the death of Walter Somerville Gurney, the hall and estate were sold in 1945. The mansion was demolished in 1965. It is not known what happened to the fine oak staircase!
